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Foreword



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School education and its quality are the key enablers for the progress of a nation. High quality school education can increase the productivity of a nation, lead to better health, nutrition and promote better livelihoods for all. India has 264 million children in schools at pre-primary and primary levels, with about 1.5 million schools across the country. The overwhelming number of 1.1 million are government schools.

The private sector runs close to 3 lakh schools in India which cater to higher-income sections of society. Many of these schools are funded and operated by corporates through their foundations and a significant number of government schools are also taken up by these foundations as part of their corporate social responsibility (CSR). The large and diversified student population across the country and the differing models and resource access give rise to several key challenges. Solutions to these requires the combined efforts of both Government and industry.

Under India's federal system, the Central Government provides policy guidelines to State Governments which then frame regulations on the basis of their specific demographic requirements. As a result, the Performance Grading Index (PGI) of the Ministry of Education shows vast variations among states on school education parameters.

The CII – Deloitte Report on School Education titled Yearly Status of School Education (YeSSE) is conceptualized as a simplified way of presenting data at one place providing a snapshot of the status of school education in each State and Union Territory.

This report has been developed on the lines of a similar report for higher education, called the Annual Status of Higher Education (ASHE), which CII and Deloitte have been preparing for the past 10 years.

I believe this report will become a useful repository of information on school education and will help policymakers and corporates in their strategies.

Foreword



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The school education segment has for long felt a need for a source of reliable comprehensive analysis at the state and union territory level. To meet this requirement, CII and Deloitte have expanded their association beyond the “Annual Status of Higher Education in India” report to the current report on on “Yearly Status of School Education (YesSE) 2022” in in states and union territories in India. We hope to make this report an annual exercise.

The report’s format is identical to that of the “Annual Status of Higher Education” report with a separate commentary section followed by data analysis.

Given the significant disruption caused by COVID-19, the commentary section starts with a chapter on “School education post the pandemic.” The chapter captures some key initiatives and measures launched by policymakers and schools to address the adverse impact of COVID-19 on the school education system. This is followed by a chapter on “Early childhood care and education,” which is one of the cornerstones of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and of particular relevance to the school education ecosystem. Finally, the report has a chapter on “Implementation of NEP 2020,” which highlights some key measures undertaken after the announcement of the policy.

The data section carries country-level analysis and trends for key parameters, such as Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER), enrolment levels at different stages of school education, Pupil Teacher Ratio (PTR), and infrastructure availability in schools. It captures the Performance Grading Index (PGI) score of states and union territories for 2019-20 across different parameters. This is followed by profiles of individual states and union territories.

We hope readers will find the analysis in the report useful. With the ongoing implementation of NEP 2020, the national school education system is poised for significant transformation over the near term, which is likely to benefit significant sections of the population. We hope that our first report on “Yearly Status of School Education (YesSE) 2022” in in states and union territories in India carried this positive sentiment to our readers.

Part I - Focus on key themes and developments

Introduction

During 2020 and 2021, school education across the world was deeply affected by COVID-19; the situation was similar in India. Therefore, the impact of COVID-19 and the NEP 2020 constitute the twin focus of this year's commentary on the yearly status of school education in India.

The pandemic has not only caused large-scale disruptions in school students' education but has also affected their overall development. While students with adequate connectivity and personal devices may have transitioned to virtual learning, a large segment has faced difficulties with internet connectivity and access. Similarly, several schools have had challenges in making a smooth and efficient transition to online learning, leaving their students with few learning opportunities. Therefore, while many schools and students were able to continue some education during the pandemic through self-learning, parent-assisted learning or virtual learning, many others faced a severe impact on their learning. The impact was particularly adverse for socially and economically disadvantaged groups, children with special needs, and those on the wrong side of the digital divide. As we come out of the pandemic in the education sector, our approach towards education will need significant transformation for the post-COVID world.

Our first chapter (School education post the pandemic) analyses how school education would need to adopt itself in the post pandemic times.

Other major developments over the past one and a half year have been the launch of NEP 2020. As the country has entered the second year after the policy's launch, it is a timely opportunity to analyse two of the key themes of the policy – early childhood education and integrating vocational education in school education. The second chapter (early childhood education) analyses the implications of the policy objectives for our schools. Any commentary on the status of school education in India will not be complete without presenting a snapshot of how the implementation of the national education policy has progressed. This is covered in chapter 3 (status of NEP implementation).

These three chapters in part one of this report would complement to the numbers, figures, and trends at the states and union territory levels in part two of the report.

1. School education post the pandemic

Late last year, the Education Council of CII constituted a committee to deliberate on the issues related to the impact of COVID-19 and implications for schools post the pandemic.

The committee deliberated on implications of COVID-19 for schools of different kinds and what that could mean for school education in the future. It also noted that some measures are likely to lead to significant benefits for the school education system.

Key inputs and recommendations

The COVID-19 waves in 2020 and 2021 were severe and widespread across India, affecting each aspect of our lives, including education across levels. The impact particularly on students without internet connectivity or access to appropriate devices and those from schools that could not transition effectively to remote teaching has been large. The situation has been worse for students who have lost their loved ones or those whose families have suffered job losses or economic hardships. The impact of the pandemic has not only been on the academic realm but has also felt on the psychological and emotional aspects.

The pandemic has particularly affected students who were at critical stages of their education, such as those in class XII or seeking admissions or having secured admissions to Indian or foreign universities. Students preparing for competitive exams have also been affected. The impact may vary from having to live without sports/physical activities or time with friends or missing out on time at school, being forced to skip laboratory work and unable to travel for education abroad, to losing a year. Some of these impacts are long term and may end up affecting students' career.

What could the students caught in this health storm do? What can the academic institutions do? And how can schools build resilience into the system to ensure that such shocks do not adversely affect students.

Students need constant reassurance from parents, teachers, and counsellors during such phases. They need support to focus on what is in their control. They must be guided that they retain the option to use the time available for reflecting on their life goals, connecting with family members better, and acquiring knowledge and skills. They can acquire various skills through self-learning and by using the resources available. They must know that those who use such times well will be better positioned to take up opportunities that will unravel later.

However, we cannot ignore reality that the learning loss caused by the pandemic is immense. A significant number of children had to discontinue learning and study for over a year. Gains of several years of efforts in India in the field of school education may have been undone, although the central government and state governments made several attempts to continue education through virtual sessions using various online meeting platforms. Some state governments, realising that many students do not have access to online learning devices, used innovative approaches to teach their students. These included developing and distributing home learning material; community teaching with teachers going into communities to teach; live and recorded lessons through TV channels; pairing of students (each one teach one); and tablet/mobile-based teaching by teachers and field staff. State governments also organised online classes at Common Services Centres (CSCs)/Gram Panchayat premises; and deployed mobile learning vehicles accompanied by teachers and volunteers.

The past two years have not been challenging for students alone. Teachers too have felt helpless when they could not provide quality education to students. Schools particularly boarding schools have had financial difficulties. Many of students' parents have also gone through difficult times. In the midst of this gloom, there have been heartwarming and inspirational stories of people fighting the pandemic together – schools caring for their employees and teachers going out of the way to teach despite limitations; and parents and schools supporting each other.

As students have gradually returned to schools, the school authorities will need to train teachers and staff to help students resettle. Parent-teacher meetings, examinations, seminars, hobby classes, cafeteria, lab work, and sports activities will need to be adjusted/modified keeping in mind students' well-being. There will also be a need for screening students for infections, responding to students who have been affected significantly, and expanding infrastructure and digital facilities and communication facilities at schools. Depending on available resources, schools would need to transition to safer/low-touch systems, such as automatic doors and lumen-sensing light switches.

Over the longer term, to prepare themselves for similar situations, schools will need to build bandwidth-light digital learning systems, including asynchronous learning systems that run on low or intermittent bandwidth for students who may be in low bandwidth zones. They will also need to develop learning delivery mechanisms that do not require personal devices. Governments may again need to take a lead in developing these approaches at an overall level.

There might also be a need to include mandatory courses on personal hygiene, improving immunity, social skills without proximity, using technology, social distancing, amongst others. Many of these will need to factor in learnings and experiences from COVID-19.

While the government will need to proactively design policy, regulations, and safety nets, schools need to re-design and re-imagine their delivery models and communication mechanisms. The pandemic has provided us significant learnings that will help provide effective and coordinated response from multiple stakeholders (including the government, schools, students, private sector, civil society organisations, and the larger community) should we face similar challenges in the future.

2. Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE): Foundation of learning

The Education Council of CII constituted a committee last year to deliberate on the issues related to early childhood care and education especially in the context of NEP 2020.

The committee noted that the NEP interventions have far-reaching benefits for the development and health of children in pre-school years. If implemented well, these interventions may have a significant positive impact on India's human development index.

Key inputs and recommendations

NEP has brought in several revolutionary interventions in school education. The approach to Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) for children aged 3-8 is one of them. The ECCE segment is divided into two sub-segments - Anganwadis/Balvatikas/preparatory schools for children in the age group of 3-6 years; and class 1-2 of the primary school in the age group of 7-8 years. This is a five-to-six-year window of significance that the policy has laid a special emphasis on.

NEP envisages that by 2030, students entering Grade 1 will be school ready through ECCE. The policy focuses on physical and motor, cognitive, socio-emotional-ethical, cultural/artistic, communication and early language, literacy, and numeracy development.

In fact, NEP is targeting not just the 3-8 age group but also the 0-3 age group. The policy envisages that NCERT should develop National Curricular and Pedagogical Framework for Early Childhood Care and Education (NCPFECCE). The framework will include a sub-framework for the 0-3 age group and another for the 3-8 age group, in addition to a guide for parents (particularly for the 0-3 year period) and institutions (for 3-8 year period).

Three broad structures may emerge. The first structure is the one with standalone Anganwadi centres and Balvatikas catering to children in the 3-6 age bracket, with class 1-2 being at primary schools elsewhere, as is the case at present. In the second structure, Anganwadi centres and Balvatikas are co-located with primary schools. The third structure could be primary schools adding sections that cater to the 1-year pre-school/Balvatika segment, while Anganwadi centres could be elsewhere. Each structure would need different kinds of infrastructure and human resources, and training. The first structure would need strengthening Anganwadi centres and Balvatikas; training workers and resource centres in curriculum and pedagogy of ECCE; and training primary school teachers in class 1-2 component of ECCE. The second structure would require workers/resource centres at Anganwadi centres and Balvatikas, and primary school teachers to collaborate and even be trained together. In case of the third structure, additional infrastructure and resource people would be needed at primary schools for Balvatikas and there would be a need for training primary school teachers in class 1-2 component of ECCE.

Physical amenities at Anganwadi centres will need to be improved. These centres need well-ventilated, well-designed, child-friendly, well-constructed, and high-quality infrastructure. They can also benefit from an enriched learning environment, play equipment, and a better institutional mechanism to enable children's visits to primary schools for a smooth transition.

Apart from learning and teaching under the ECCE, the interventions should focus on mid-day meal, health check-ups, and growth monitoring for children aged 3-8.

The policy also lays down eligibility criteria for Anganwadi workers/teachers who would need to pass the 10+2 grade and would undergo a six-month certificate programme in ECCE; those with lower educational qualifications would undergo a one-year diploma programme covering early literacy, numeracy, etc., in regular/digital/distance mode. These workers/teachers shall be mentored by Cluster Resource Centres (CRCs) of the School Education Departments in states and UTs with at least one monthly contact class for continuous assessment. In the longer term, state governments shall prepare cadres of professionally qualified educators for ECCE through stage-specific professional training, mentoring mechanisms, career mapping, and Continuous Professional Development (CPD).

ECCE is planned to be included under a policy in Ashramshalas in tribal-dominated areas and in other formats of alternative schooling also.

The planning and implementation of the ECCE curriculum will be carried out jointly by ministries of HRD, Women and Child Development (WCD), Education, Health and Family Welfare (HFW), and Tribal Affairs through a special joint task force.

The government has launched Vidya Pravesh, a pre-school module. This three-month, play-based school readiness preparation module will be for students entering Grade I. Developed by NCERT, this School Preparation Module (SPM) can be adopted/adapted by states and union territories.

With a specific focus on ECCE, the NEP has made its intent clear on strengthening the foundation of learning in India. Implementation of these thoughtful and long-pending interventions will need to be undertaken with the same intent. This may then prove to be one of the most significant contributors to school education in particular and education in general. The ECCE policy direction will need to be implemented well. It will require several government agencies, including those in the School Education and WCD departments to collaborate under the umbrella of Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS). Necessary support from the Department of Panchayati Raj may also be taken for operationalising infrastructure and other facilities at local levels.

The implementation will not be without challenges. Safety of pre-primary school children, especially where Anganwadis and Balvatikas will be co-located with schools, needs to be ensured. Large-scale training of school teachers will also be required in delivering the Vidya Pravesh module and mentoring Anganwadi and Balvatika staff. These people will also need to be sensitised in aspects related to childcare. School systems will need to fill up vacant positions for school teachers as this additional ECCE work will accentuate teacher' shortage. Similarly, large-scale hiring of resource persons for Anganwadis and Balvatikas will need to be undertaken. Schools may need to construct a significant number of additional classrooms and other associated facilities, including child-friendly toilets and drinking water facilities. They should apply BALA (Buildings As Learning Aids) concepts, as well as organise child-friendly furniture, outdoor and indoor playing equipment and learning materials, pre-school books, etc. (if schools are required to add pre-school grades). For the hub-and-spoke model where a school mentors nearby Anganwadis and Balvatikas, and CRCs provide training inputs to resource persons, enabling logistics arrangement will need to be institutionalised. Further, as the mid-day meal scheme is extended to pre-primary children, adjustments may have to be made in food served and when and how it is served to younger children. Similarly, if the vaccination and food supplements and other health interventions (such as health checks, and vitamin D, iron, and deworming tablets) are incorporated to the ECCE programme, the scale and scope of work at schools may increase substantially.

The emphasis on the ECCE programme in NEP 2020 has the potential to create wide-ranging developmental benefits for India. Healthier and better prepared children entering schools could substantially enhance what they would get out of school education.

3. Implementation of NEP 2020

The launch of the National Education Policy (NEP) in 2020 was a milestone in the Indian education system. The government is making significant efforts to implement the policy and has moved ahead on several objectives in the landmark policy within two years of its launch.

It has launched several initiatives to take the agenda of the policy forward in areas ranging from pre-school education to assessment frameworks for school education.

The pre-school module should go a long way in ensuring that children from socio-economic backgrounds are ready for school in a playful, fun-filled way and benefit the most from their school journey.

On the completion of one year of NEP 2020, the government had launched Indian Sign Language as a subject. This has been a long-standing requirement and will help the hearing impaired, along with sensitising the entire society about the need to make the education system more inclusive.

Teacher training continues to be a key focus area even as multiple efforts have been made in this field. With the launch of National Initiative for School Heads' and Teachers' Holistic Advancement (NISHTHA 3.0), teacher development for preparing our students for the 21st century in line with the needs of NEP 2020, will get a new fillip.

Moreover, a competency-based assessment framework for primary grade students in CBSE schools is a welcome sign as it moves away from rote-based, high-pressure assessments to application and skill-based evaluation. The focus on introducing Artificial Intelligence (AI) is an aspirational step and aligns well with India's national strategy on AI.

As a part of NEP's implementation journey, at the national level, agencies such as the National Testing Agency (NTA), the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), the National Council for Educational Research and Training (NCERT), and the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) have been tasked with different duties to kick-start the ministry's plan from 2022-23. NCERT has been asked to work on a new curriculum, focusing on learning outcomes, from the pre-primary level to Class 12. In line with the policy that focuses on early childhood education, the council has been entrusted with the responsibility to prepare a three-month study module for students in Class 1 to make them school ready. Modules on numerical literacy, with a special focus on younger children, are also being prepared by the council.

A scan of the interventions suggests that states have taken several initiatives. Several states have created task forces and committees to implement NEP. For example, in alignment with NEP's vision of standards setting and accreditation for school education, the government of Gujarat has established Gujarat School Quality Accreditation Council (GSQAC). Further, the state has established Vidya Samiksha Kendra for real-time data and analytics-driven management of education with online attendance tracking, real-time periodic assessment, creation of student-level report card and school dashboards, and a call centre for monitoring and support.

These multiple initiatives being undertaken across the country within two years of the NEP launch provide hope that NEP will be implemented with speed and scale and the government ecosystem is building the necessary skills and systems for this purpose. Key stakeholders (central government and national agencies, state governments, and schools) would need to continue their efforts and collaborate for effective implementation of the landmark policy; trends in implementation so far have been quite encouraging.

Part II – India and state profiles in school education

India: Key statistics and trends in school education

Number of schools by management, total enrolment, and average enrolment (2020-21)

The breakdown of the number of schools in the country based on the type of management is tabulated below. There are a total of 15,09,136 schools across the country; the schools run by the Department of Education account for the largest share (51.79 percent) as well as the highest share of student enrolment (41.48 percent).

The five states with the highest number of schools are Uttar Pradesh (2,56,911, 17 percent of the total in India), followed by Madhya Pradesh (1,33,271, 8.8 percent), Maharashtra (1,10,114, 7.3 percent), Rajasthan (1,07,376, 7.1 percent), and West Bengal (95,153, 6.3 percent).

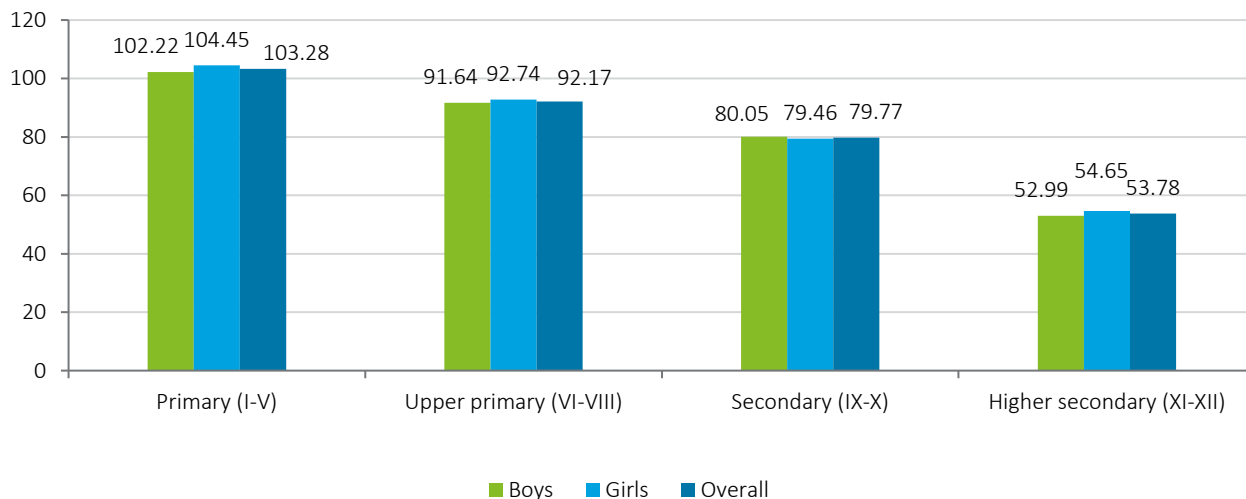
The top five states with the highest number of enrolments are Uttar Pradesh (4,64,04,506, 17.5 percent), Bihar (2,66,35,416, 10.1 percent), Maharashtra (2,25,11,839, 8.5 percent), West Bengal (1,94,05,897, 7.3 percent) and Rajasthan (1,78,57,457, 6.8 percent).

Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) (2020-21)

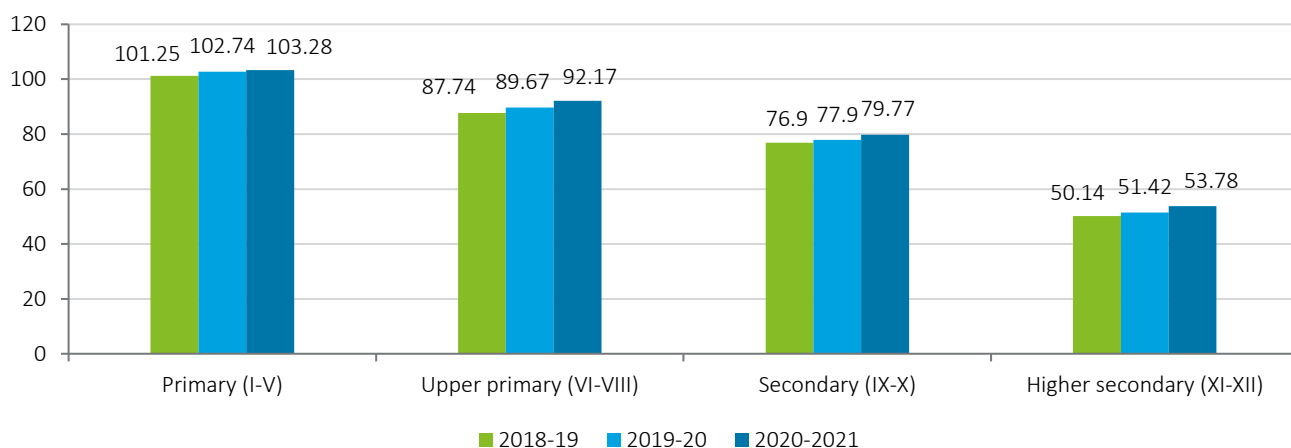
Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in 2020-21 for boys was lower than GER for girls at the primary, upper primary, and higher secondary levels. The ratio was marginally higher for boys at the secondary level. In terms of the overall GER, at the primary (I-V) level, Meghalaya ranks first (179.54) amongst states and UTs with the highest boys (176.76) and girls (182.47) GER. At the upper primary (VI-VIII) level, Delhi ranks first (124.95) amongst states and UTs with the highest boys (122.95) and girls (127.29) GER. At the secondary (IX-X) level as well, Delhi ranks at the top (116.33) with the highest boys (114.78) and girls (118.14) GER. At the higher secondary (XI-XII) level, the highest-ranking state is Himachal Pradesh with overall GER (85.55) and with the highest boys (84.15) and girls (82.19) GER.

GER during past three years

GER at each level of school education improved in 2020-21 compared with 2018-19. At the primary level, the ratio increased to 103.28 from 101.25 in 2018-19. At the upper primary level, it increased to 92.17 in 2020-21 from 87.74 in 2018-19. At the secondary level, it improved from 76.9 in 2018-19 to 79.77 in 2020-21, while at the higher secondary level, it rose to 53.78 in 2019-20 from 50.11 in 2018-19.

Number of teachers, total enrolment, and Pupil Teacher Ratio (PTR) by education level (2020-21)

The total number of teachers is 1,12,80,462 in India. Uttar Pradesh has the highest number of teachers (16,34,416), followed by Rajasthan (10,10,463), Maharashtra (8,52,857), Tamil Nadu (7,22,512), and Bihar (6,74,504).

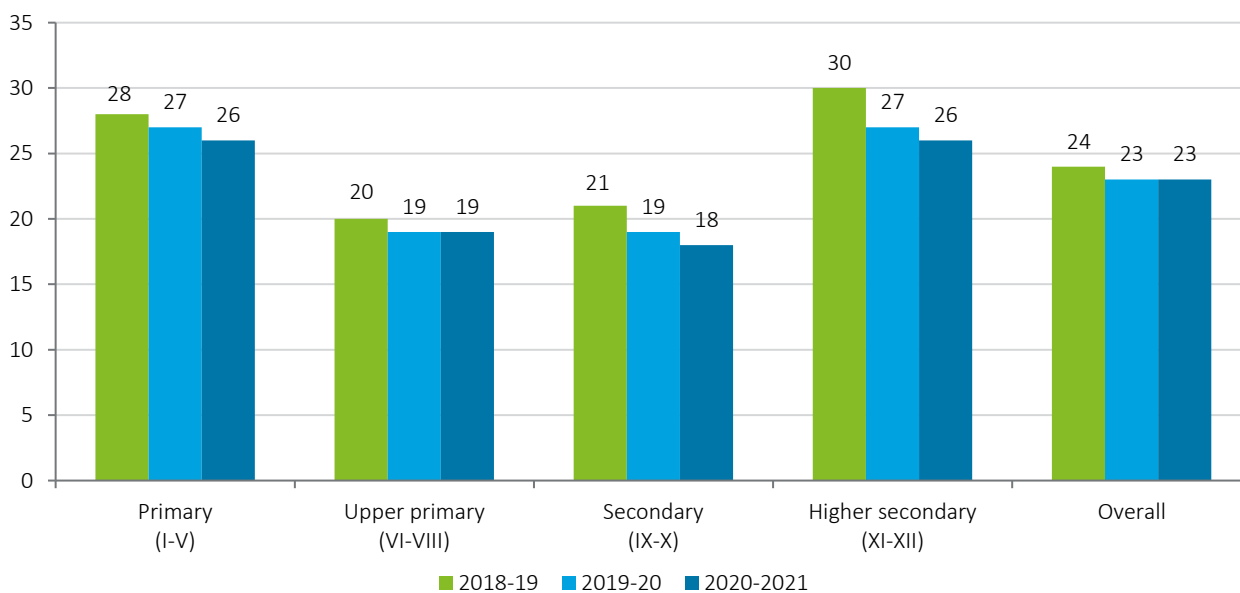
The PTR for schools in India is 23. Bihar, Jharkhand, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, and Gujarat have a PTR of 39, 30, 30, 29, and 28, respectively. Amongst states and UTs in India, Ladakh recorded the lowest PTR of 8.

PTR during the past three years

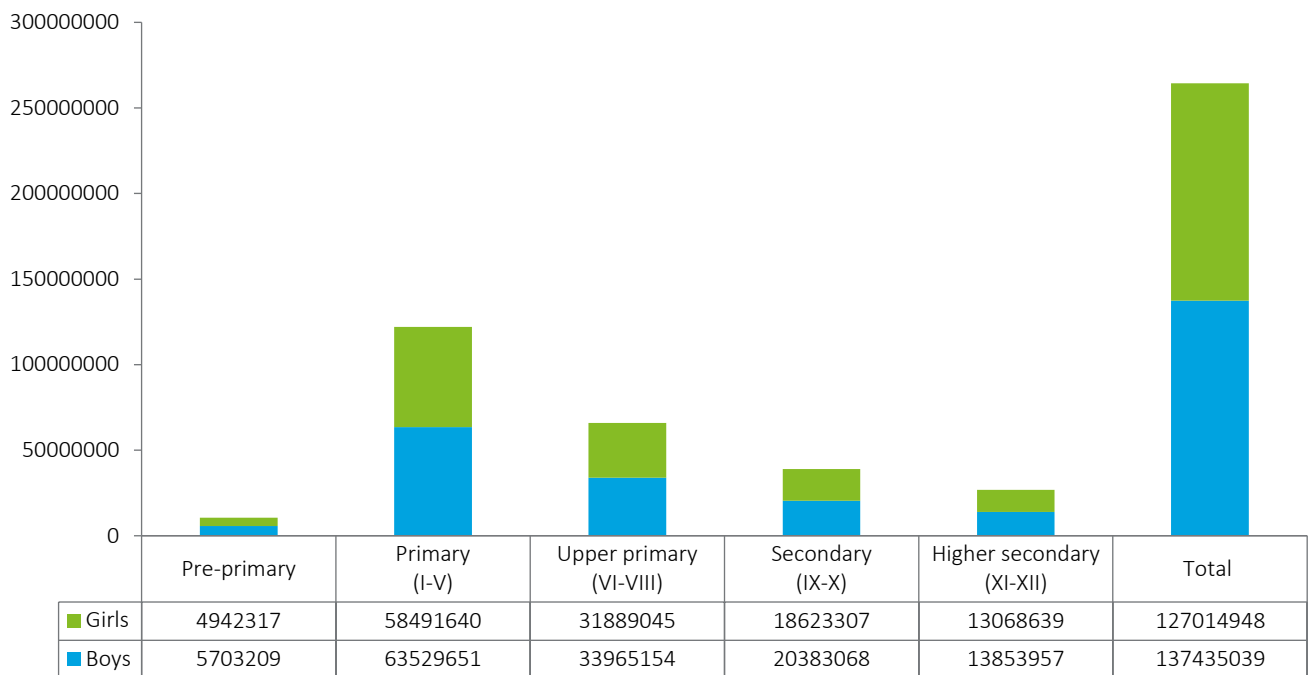
The Pupil Teacher Ratio (PTR) improved at each level of school education. The ratio for the primary level came down to 26 in 2020-21, from 28 in 2018-19. PTR for the upper primary and secondary levels reduced to 19 and 18, respectively, while that for higher secondary went down to 26 from 30 in 2018-19. The overall PTR moved from 24 in 2018-19 to 23 in 2020-21.

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)

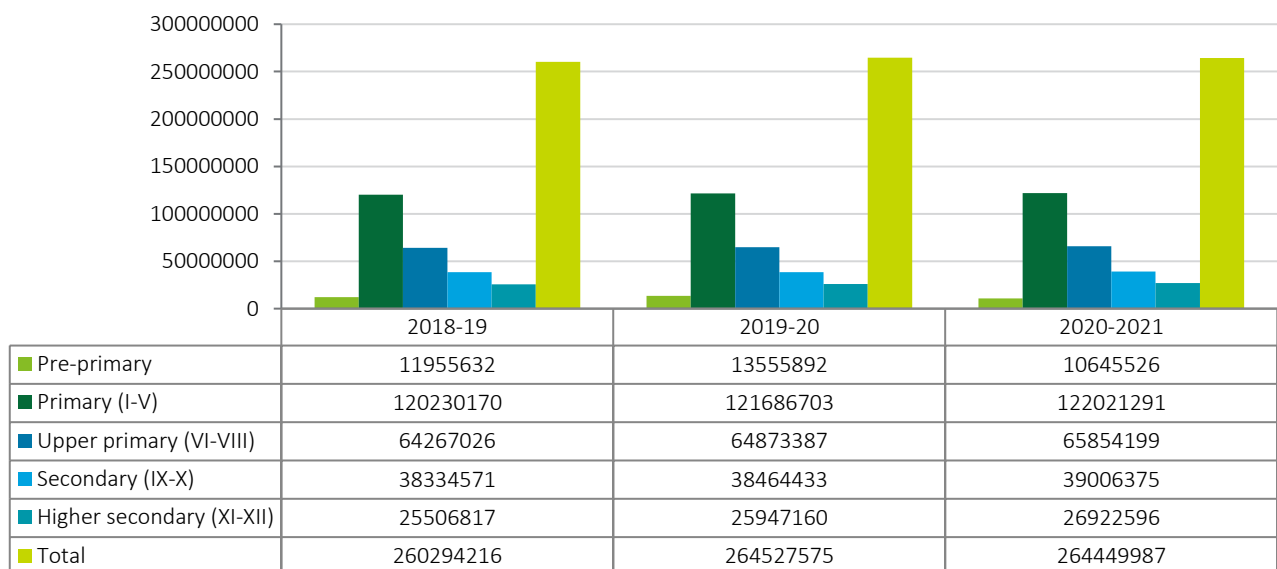
The total enrolment of students in schools, including pre-primary in India was about 26.45 crore with 52 percent boys and 48 percent girls. Uttar Pradesh ranked first in terms of enrolment (17.55 percent of total enrolment), followed by Bihar (10.07 percent), Maharashtra (8.51 percent), West Bengal (7.34 percent), and Rajasthan (6.75 percent).

Enrolment by education level during the past three years

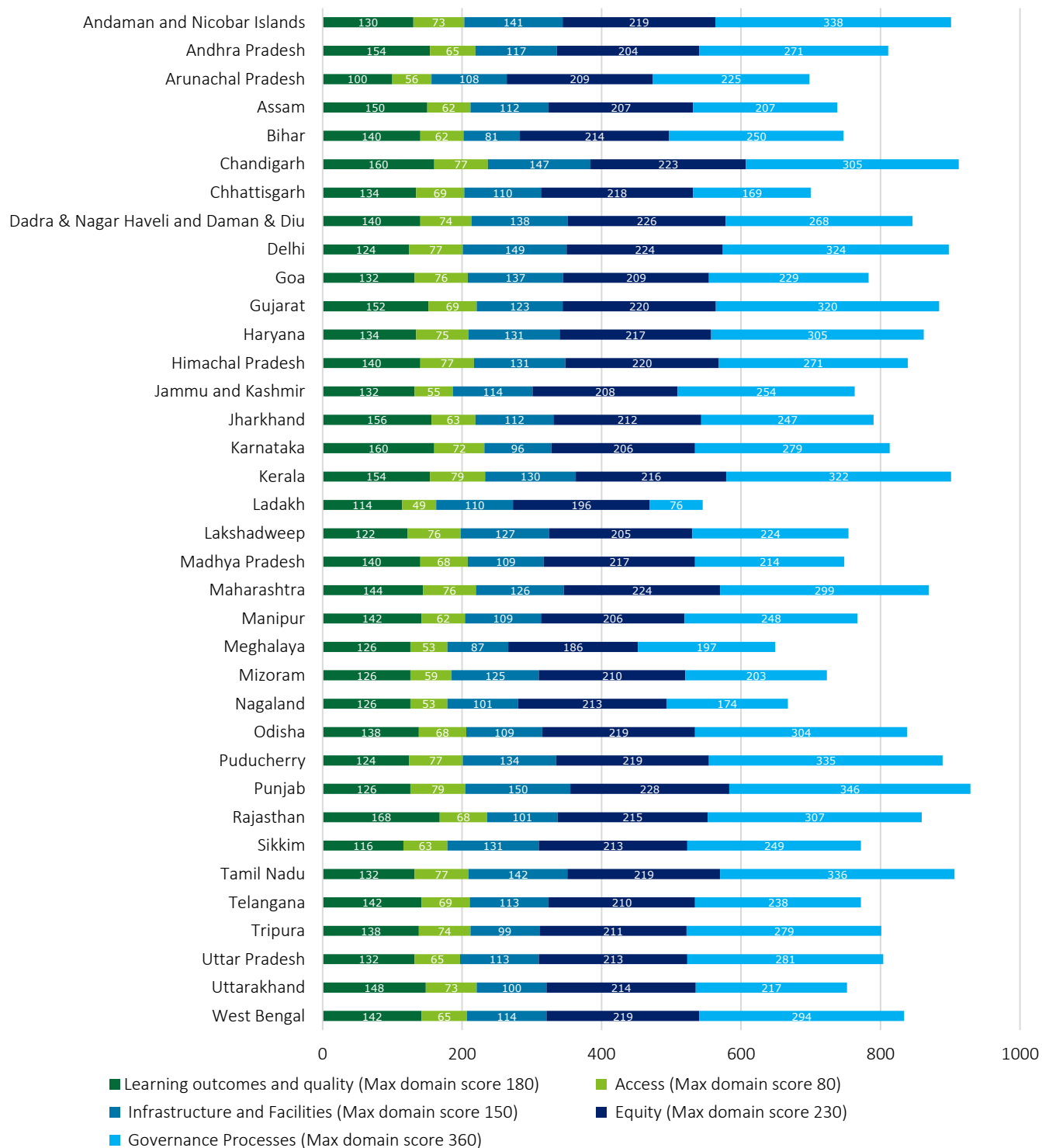

Performance Grading Index (PGI) score of states and UTs of India (2019-20)

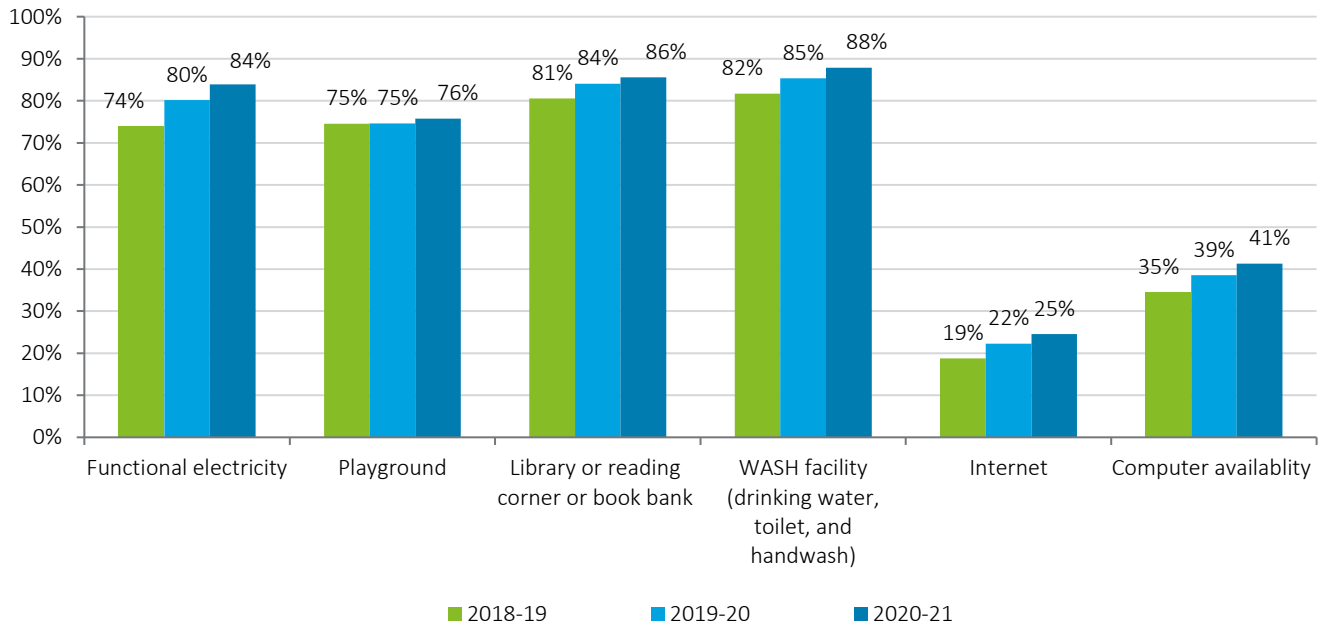
Rajasthan scored the highest (168 of 180) in learning outcomes and quality. Kerala was assessed as the best performing state in terms of access with a score of 79 from 80. Punjab was the top performing state with a score of 150 of 150, in terms of infrastructure and facilities. In terms of equity and governance processes as well, Punjab was the top scorer (228 of 230 and 346 of 360, respectively).

Availability of infrastructure and facilities in schools during the past three years

Availability of infrastructure and facilities in schools has improved during the past three years. In terms of availability of functional electricity, the percentage increased significantly from 74 percent in 2018-19 to 84 percent in 2019-20. The WASH facility also improved from 82 percent in 2018-19 to 88 percent in 2020-21. Internet facility and computer availability rose by 6 percent each during the past three years.

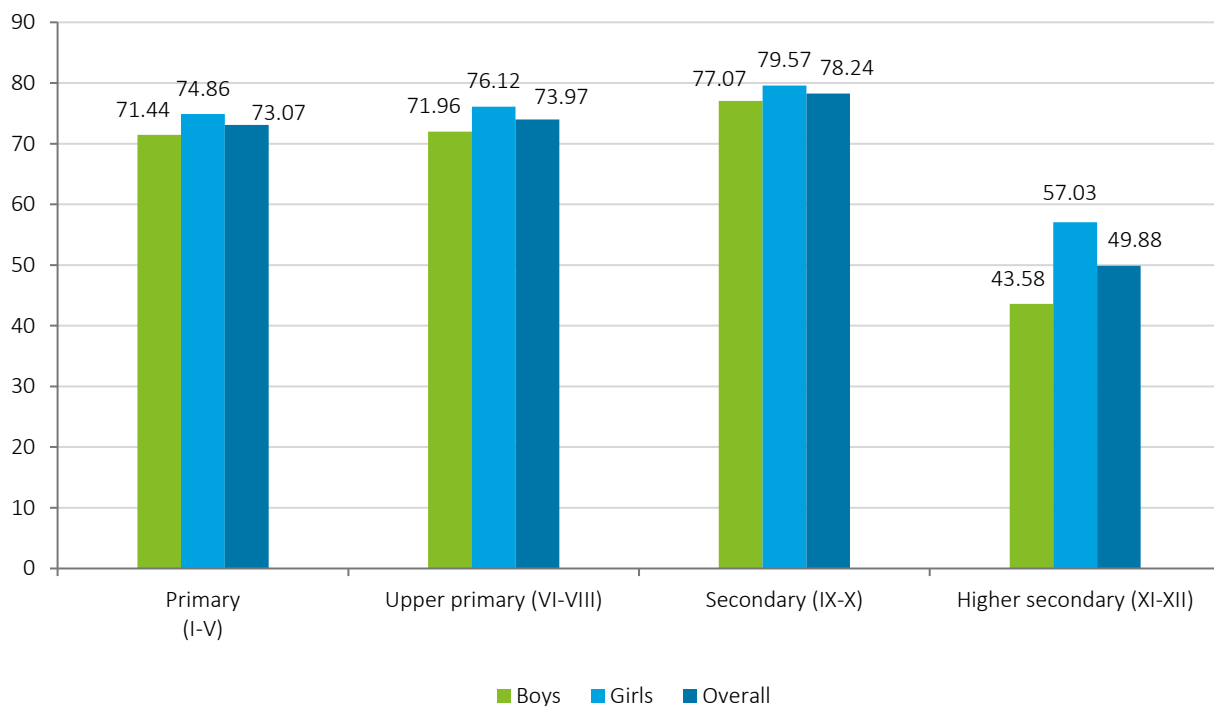

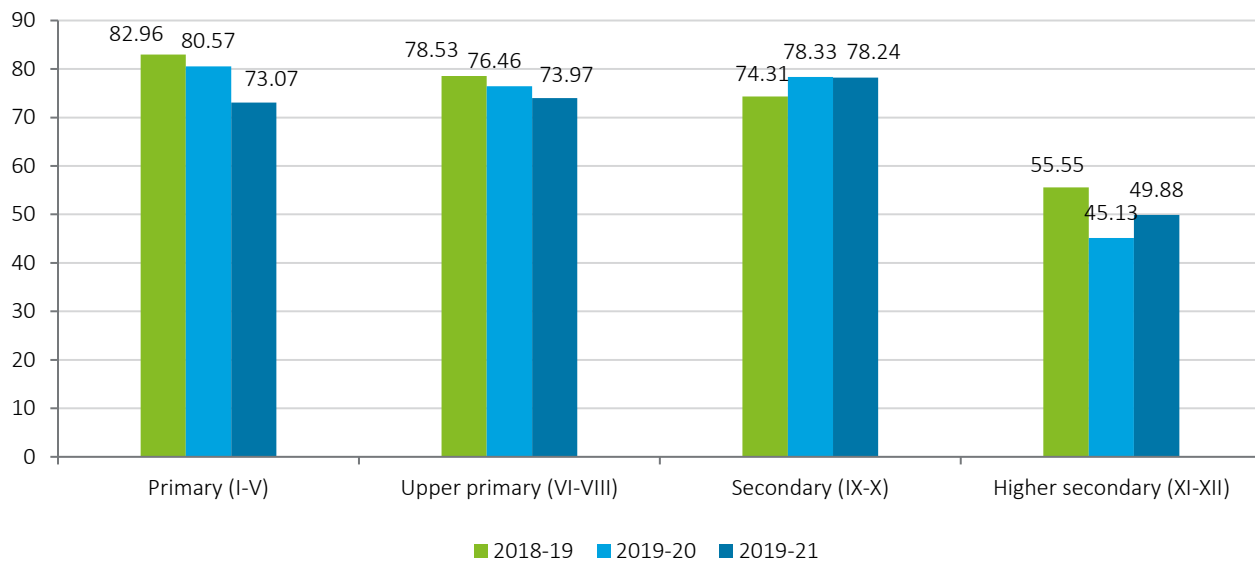

GER during the past three years



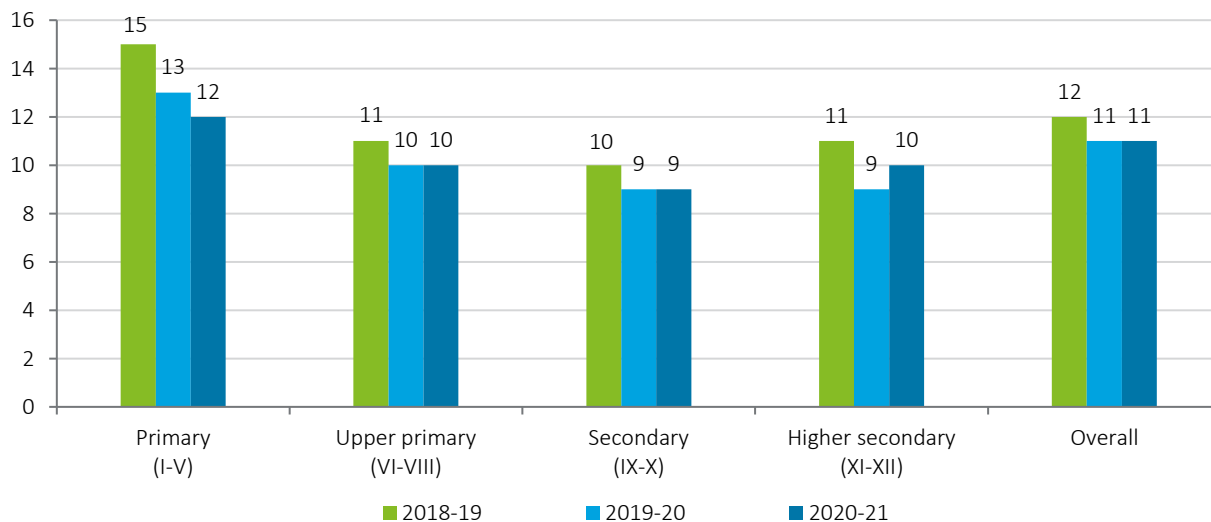

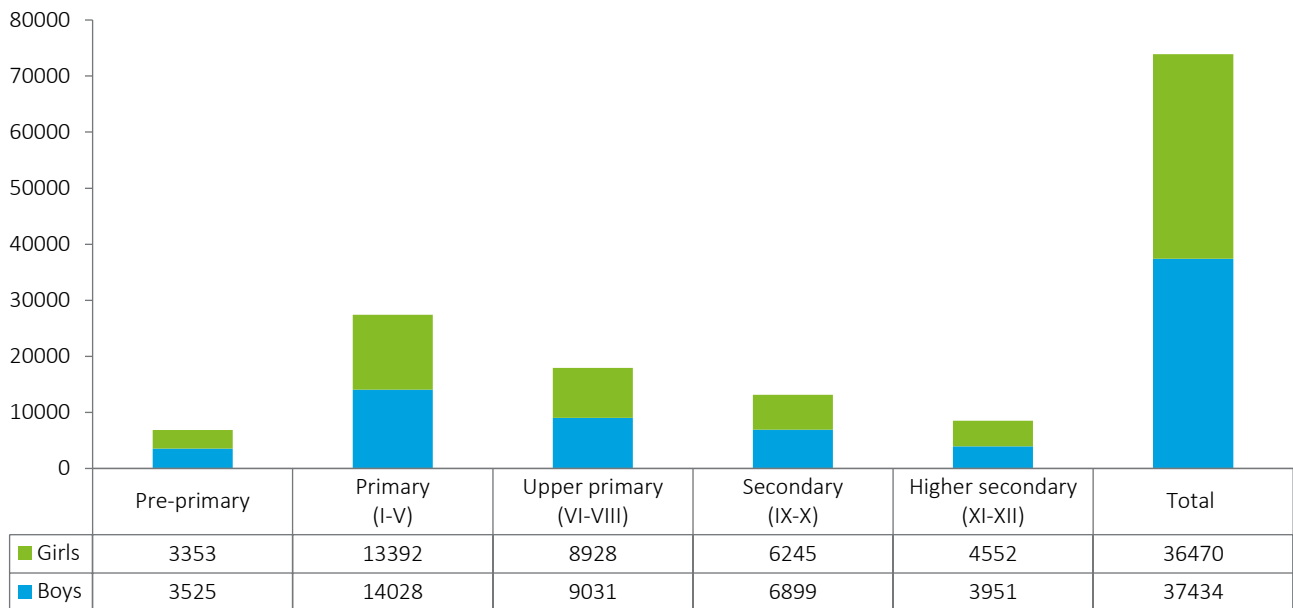

PTR during the past three years



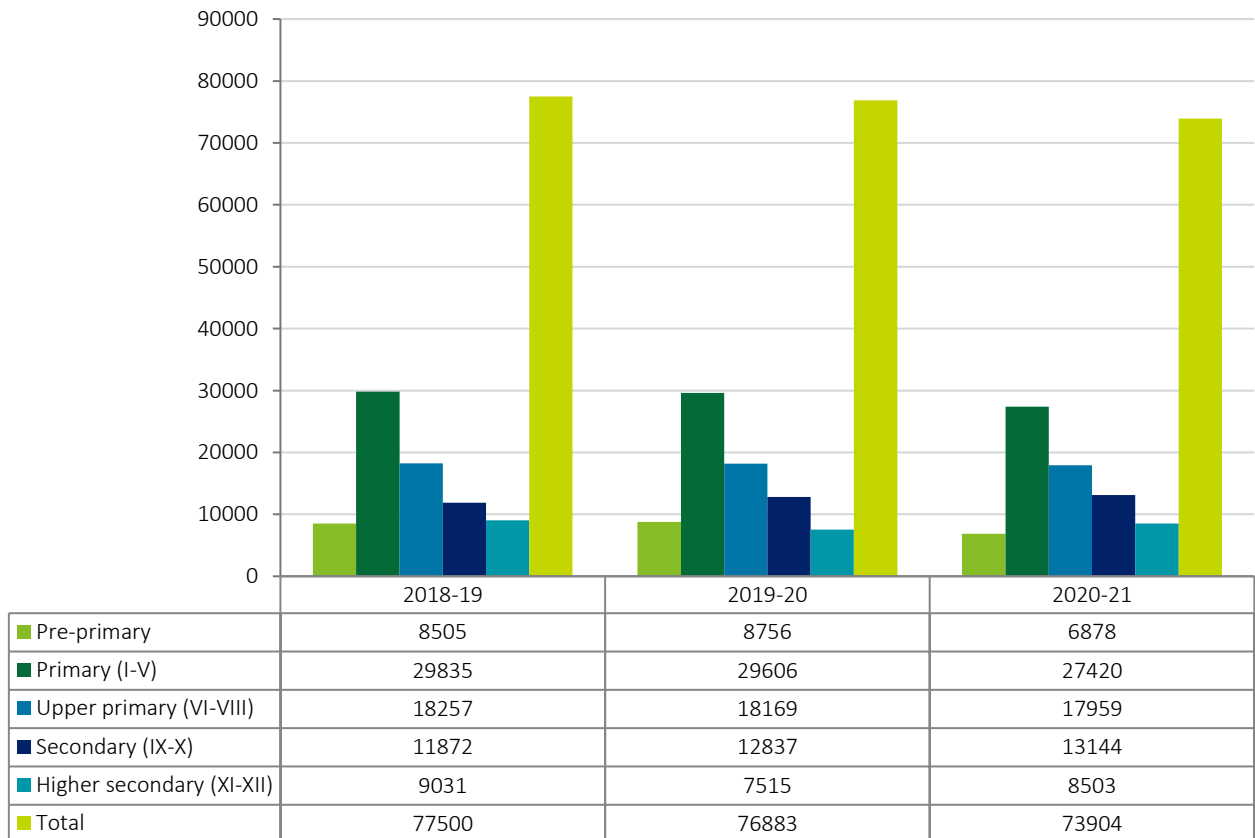

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



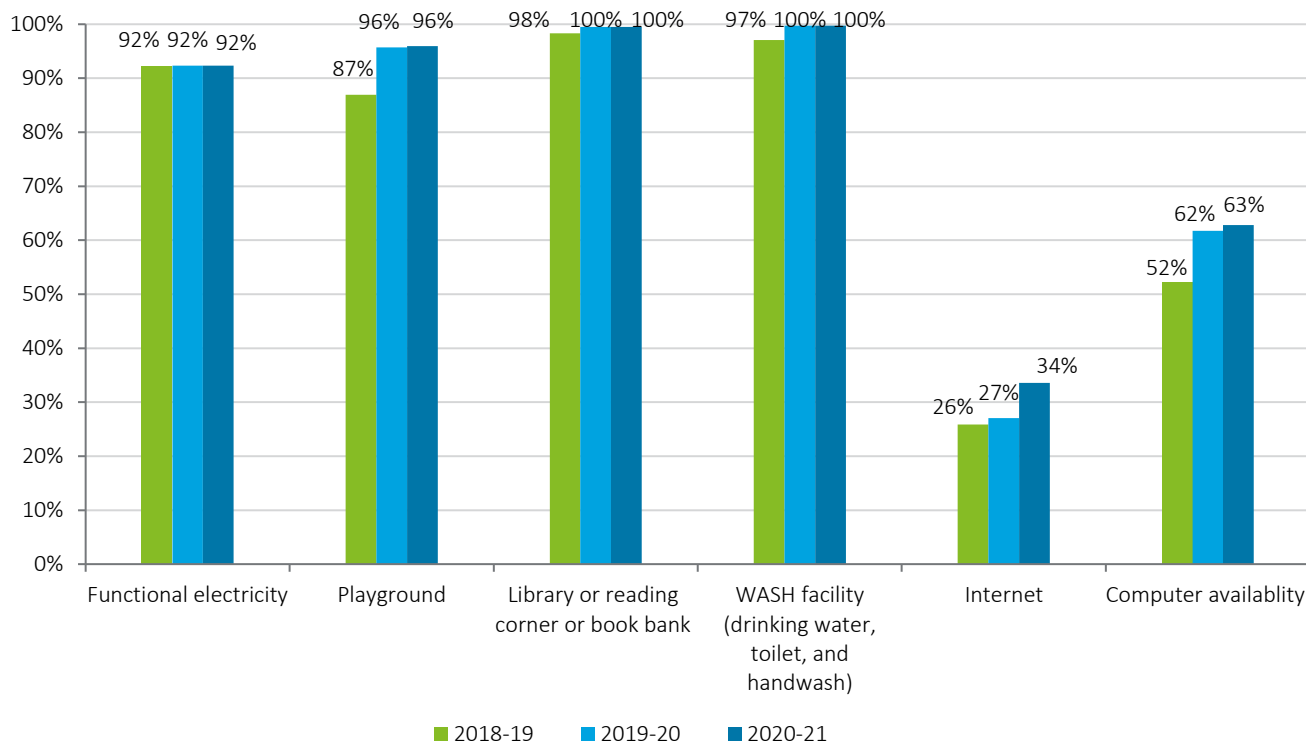

Enrolment by education level during the past three years



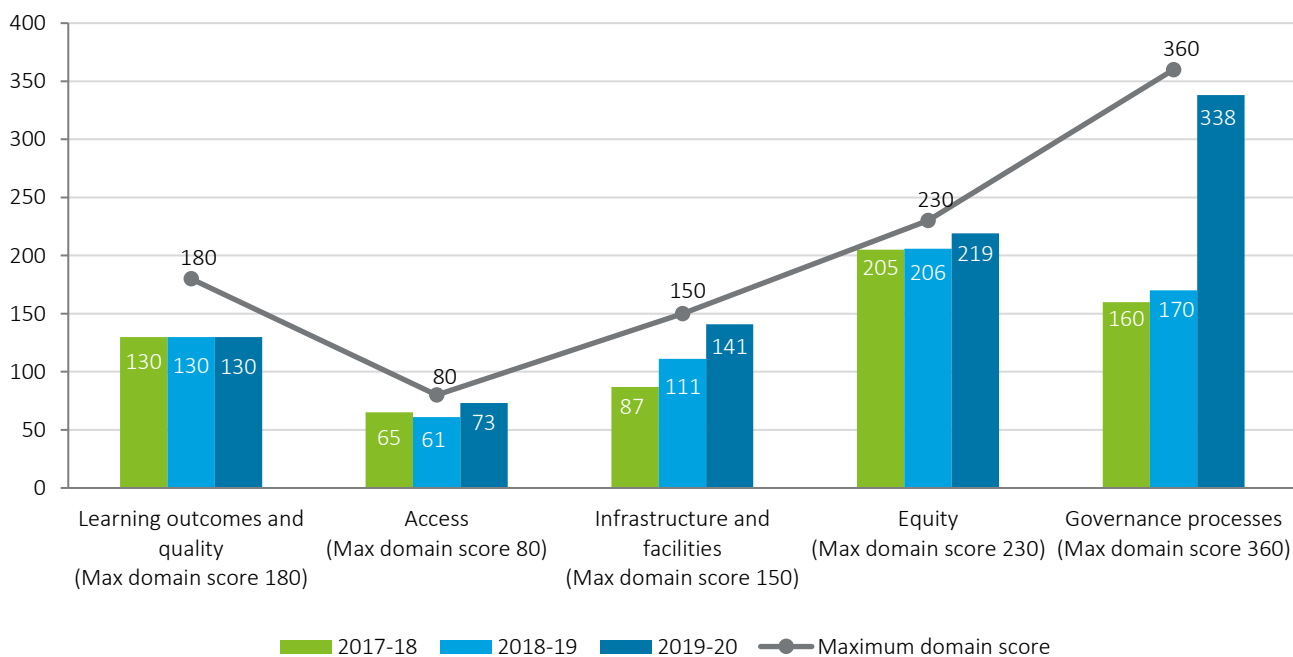

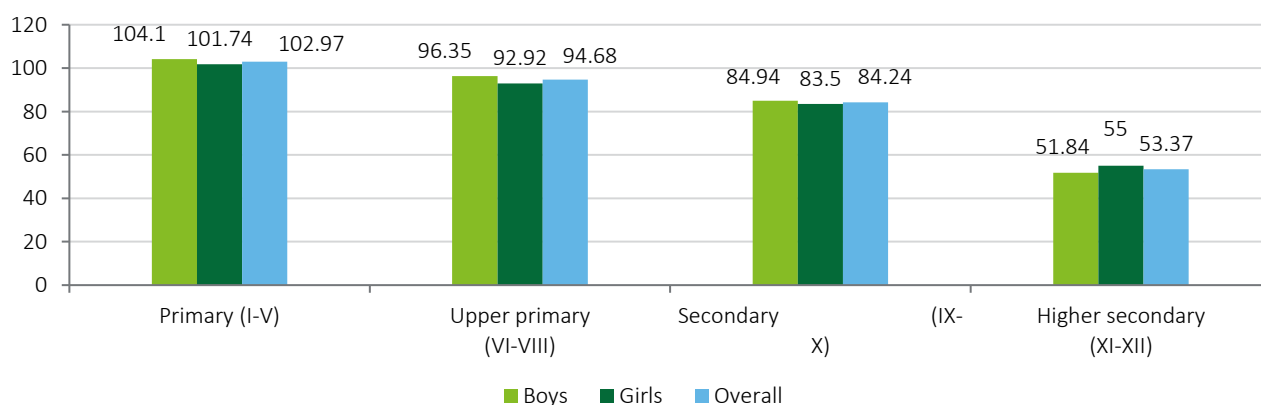

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



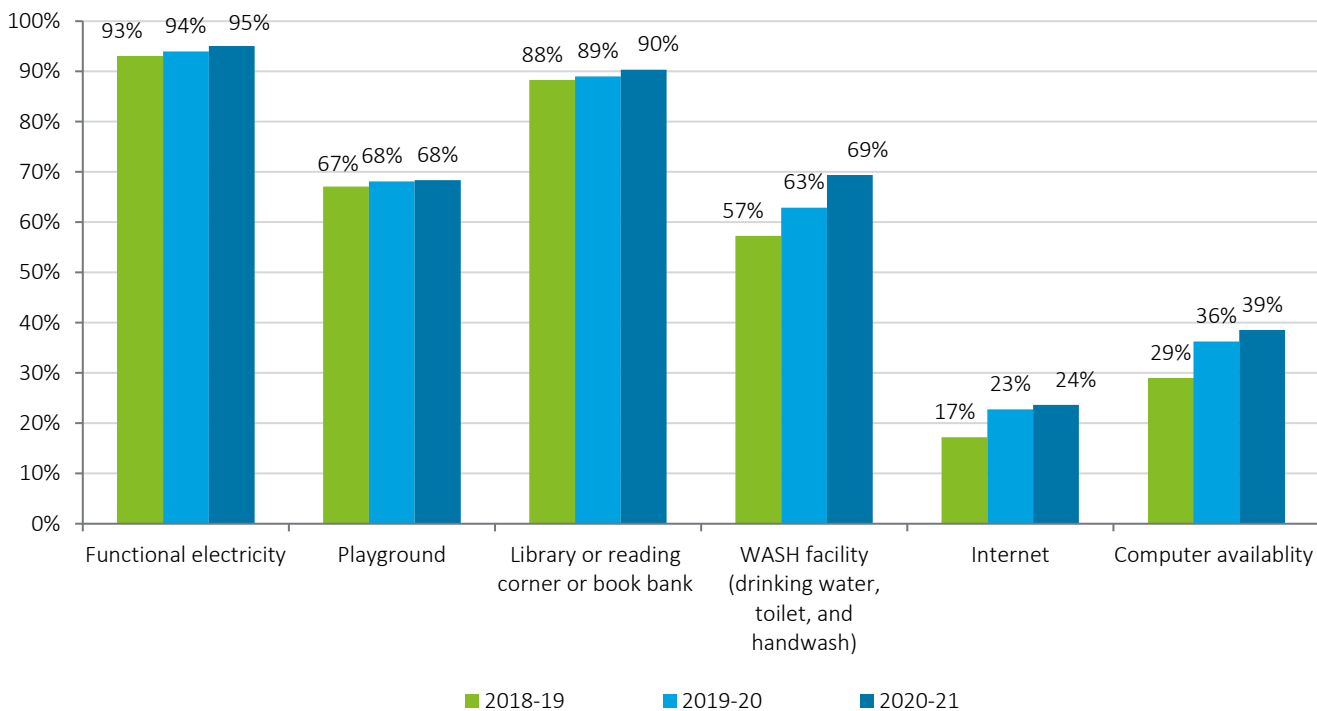

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



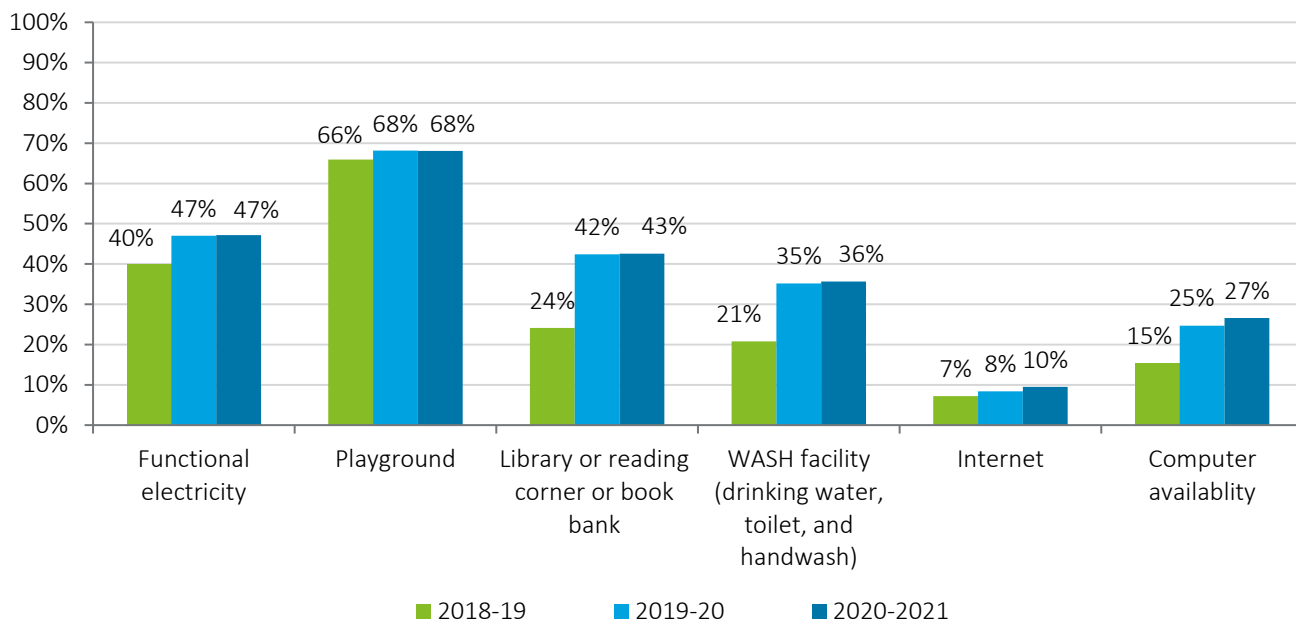

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



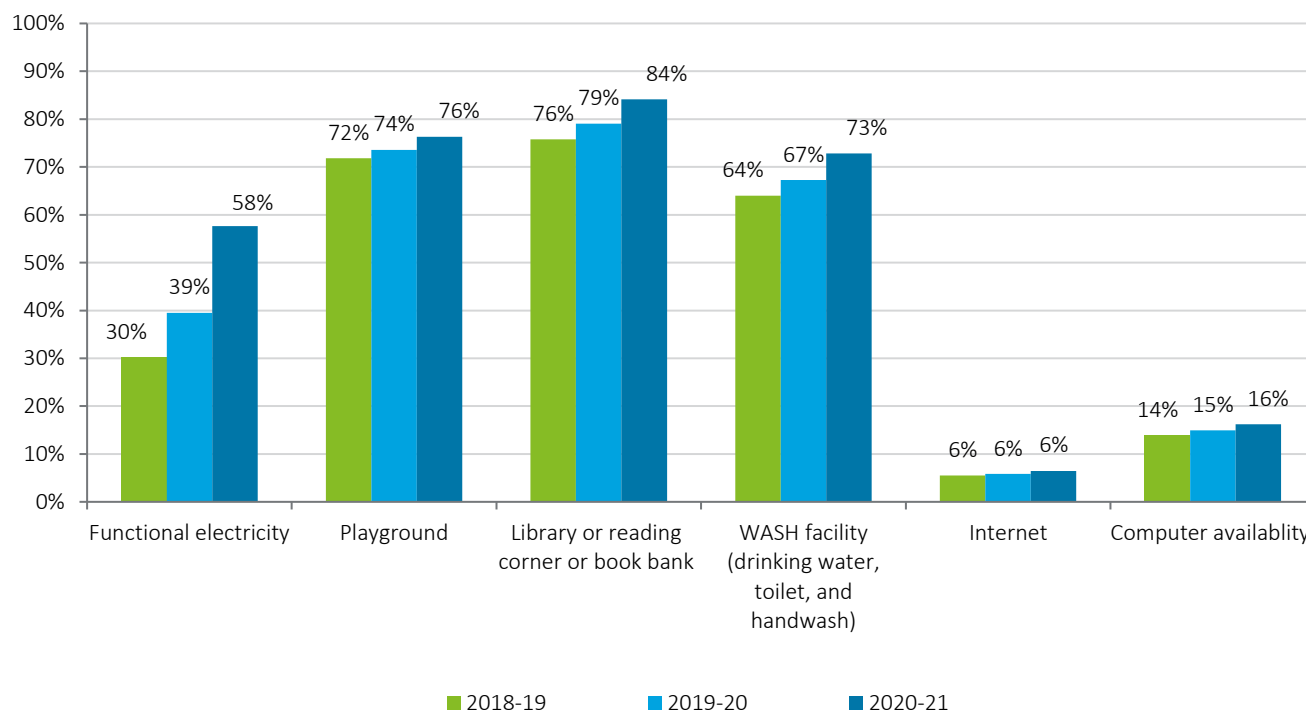

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



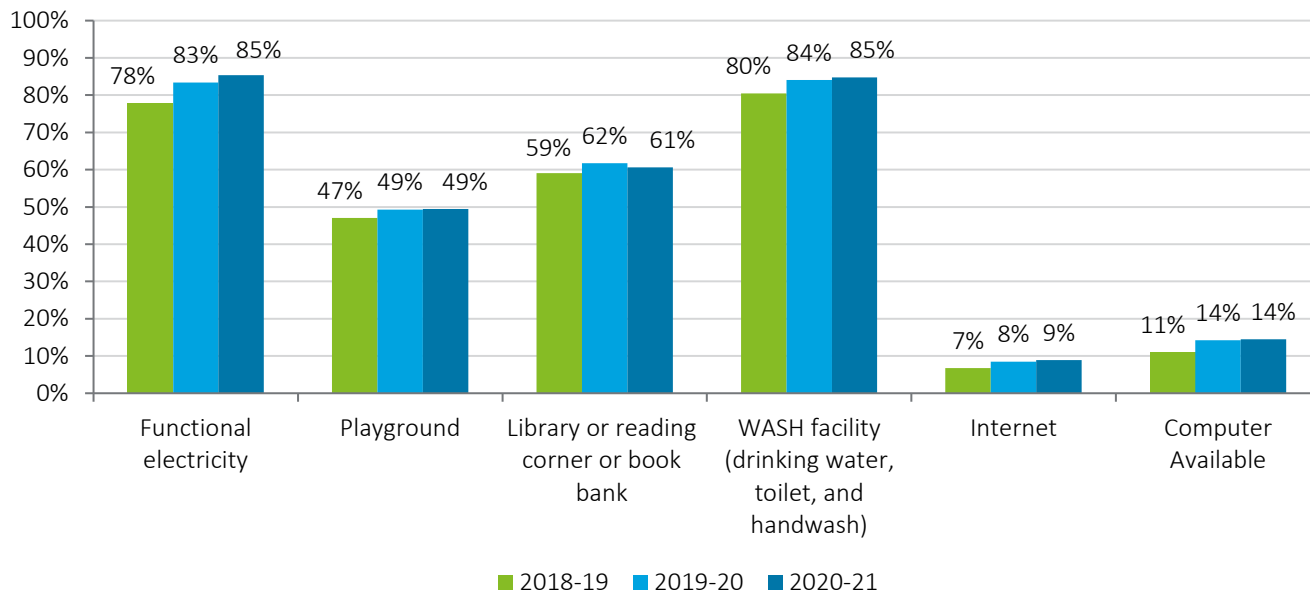

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



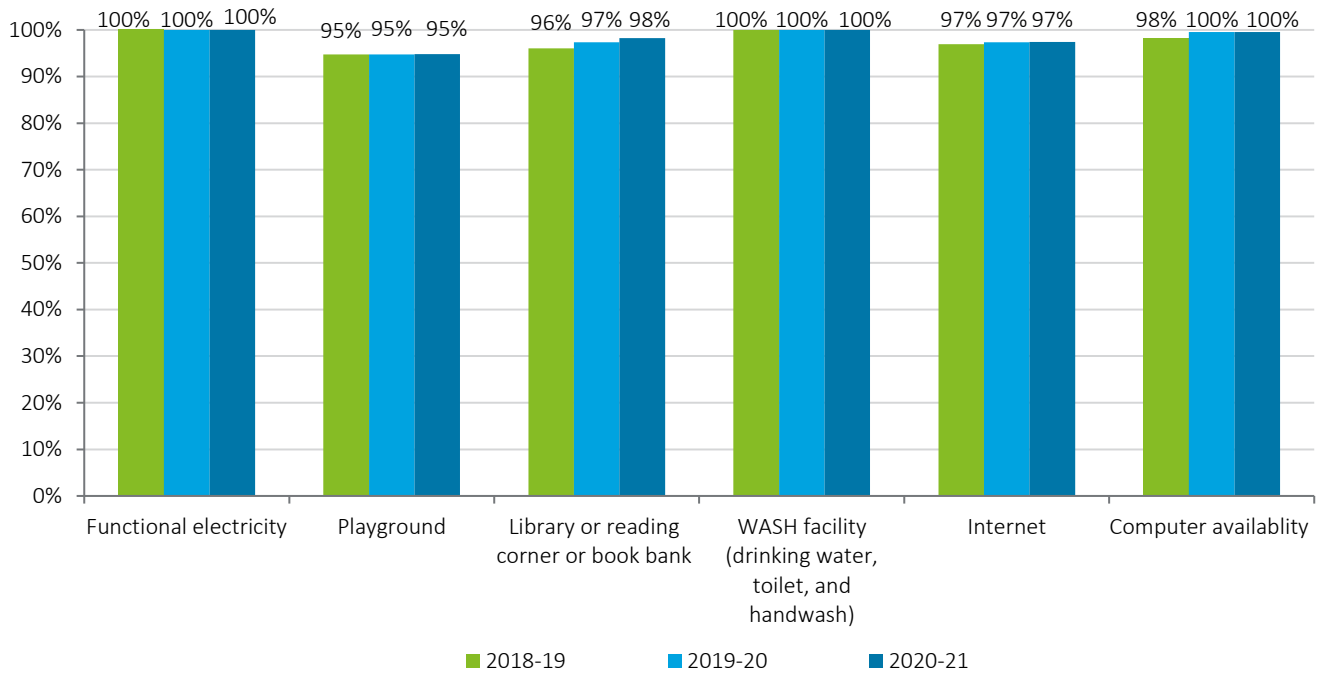

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



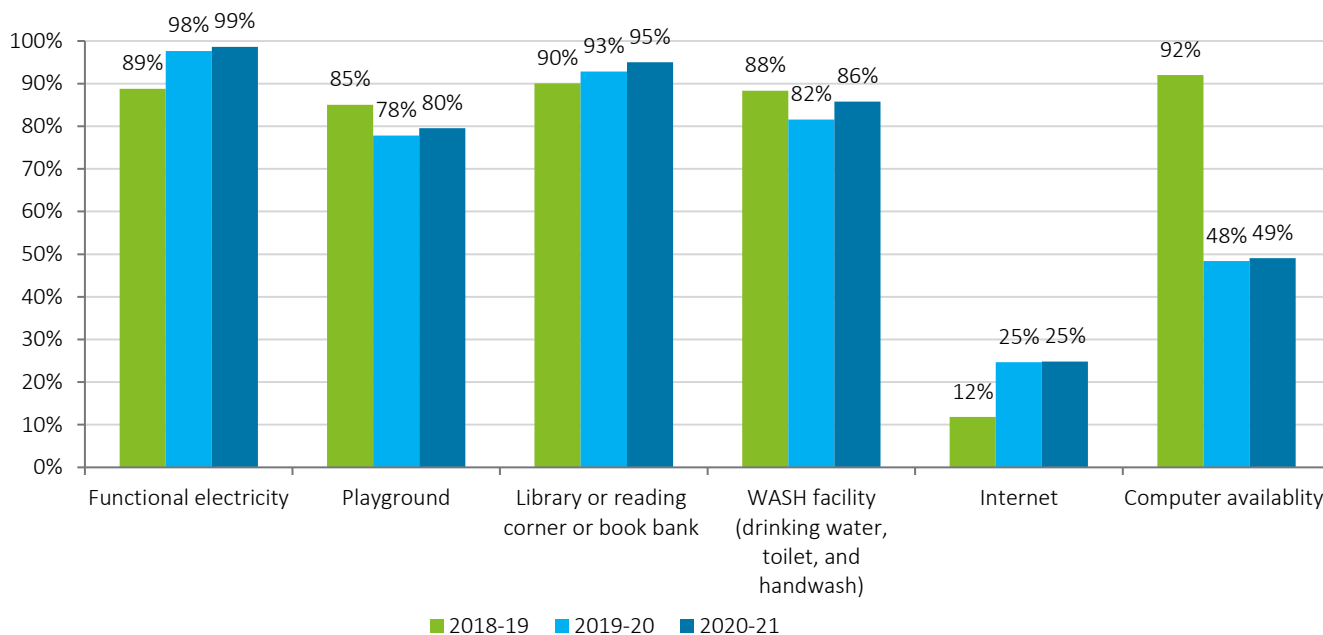

Enrolment by education level during the past three years



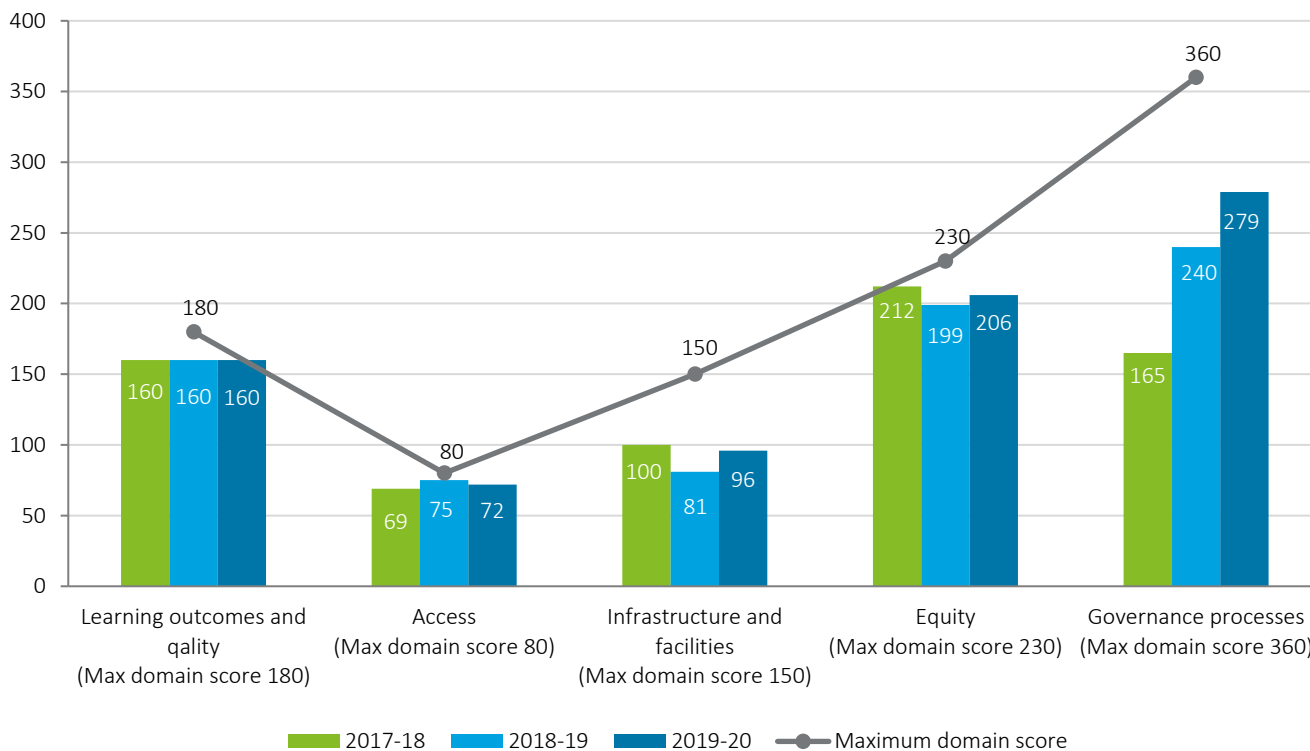

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



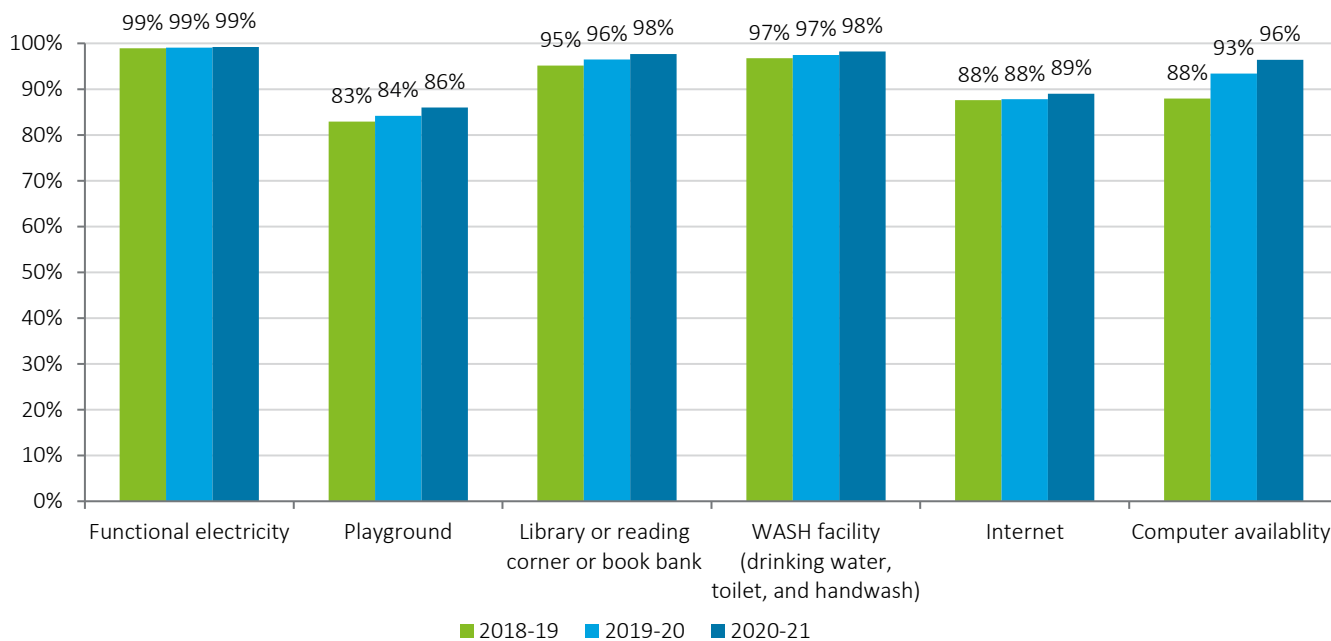

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



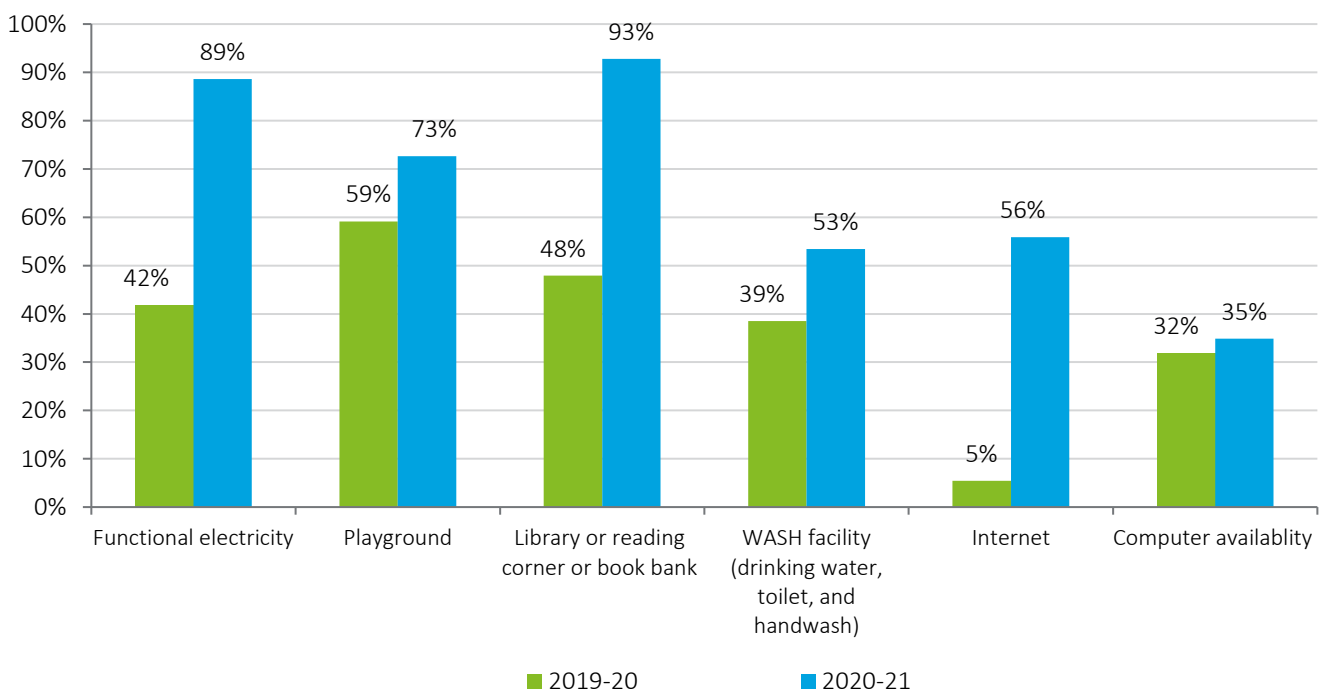

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



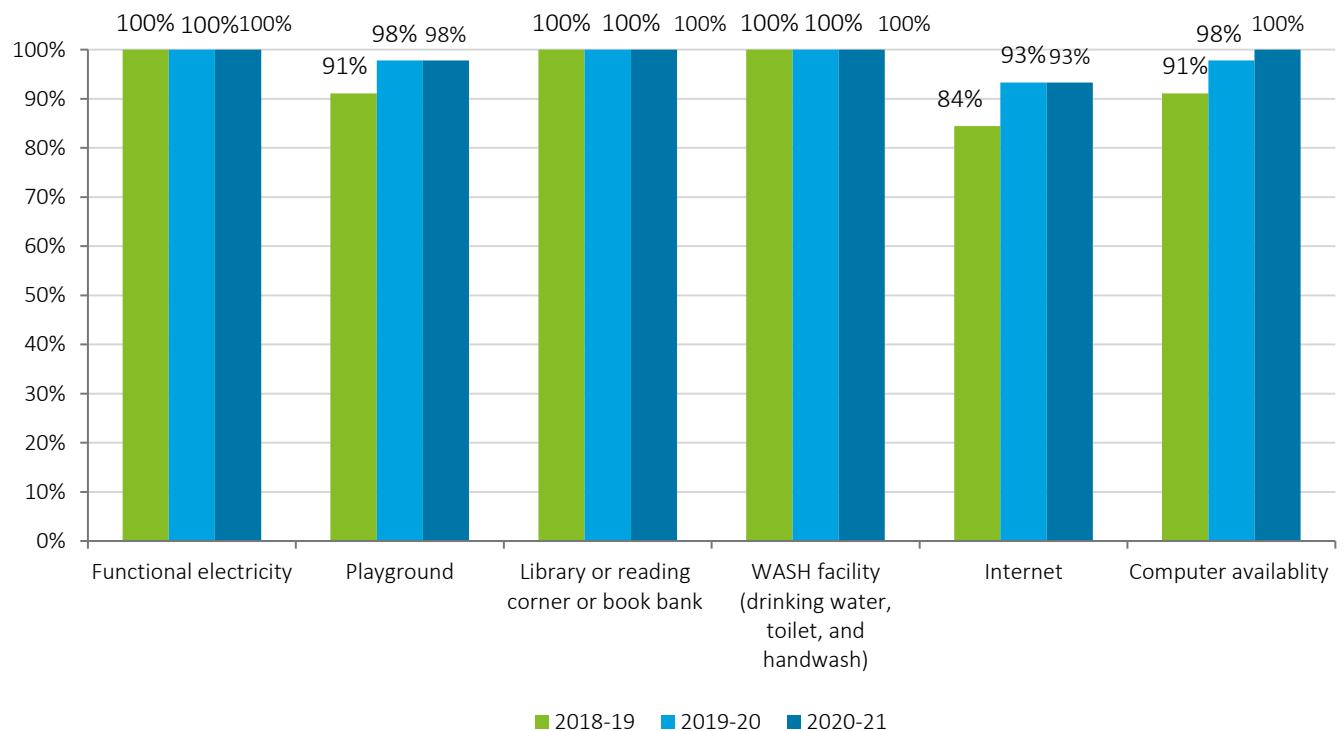

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



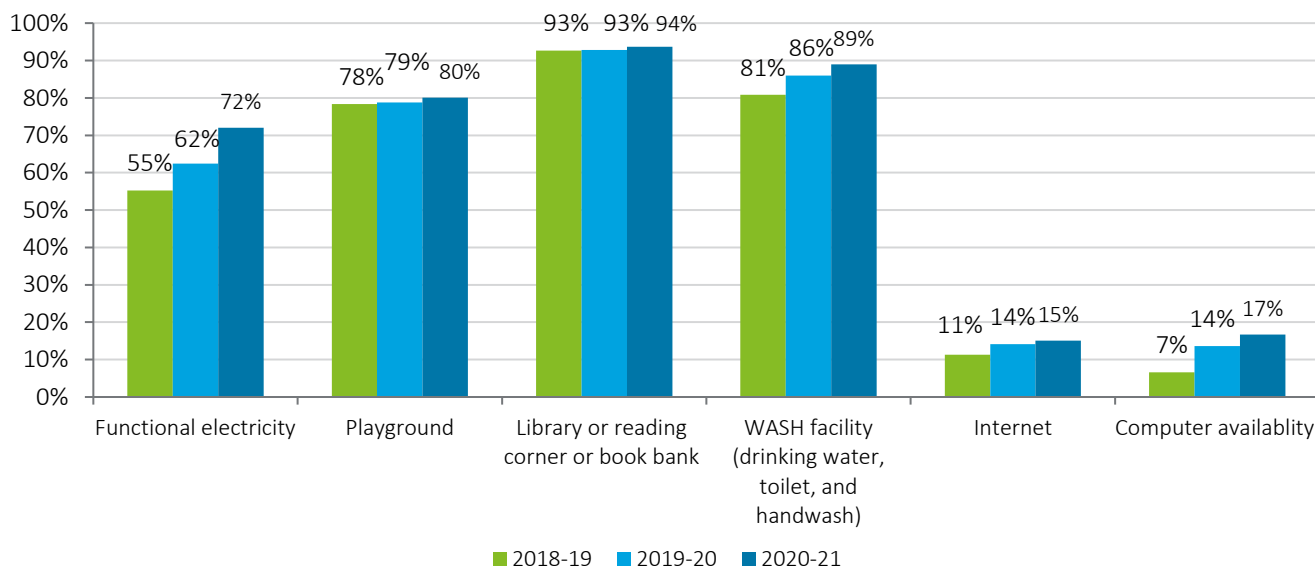

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



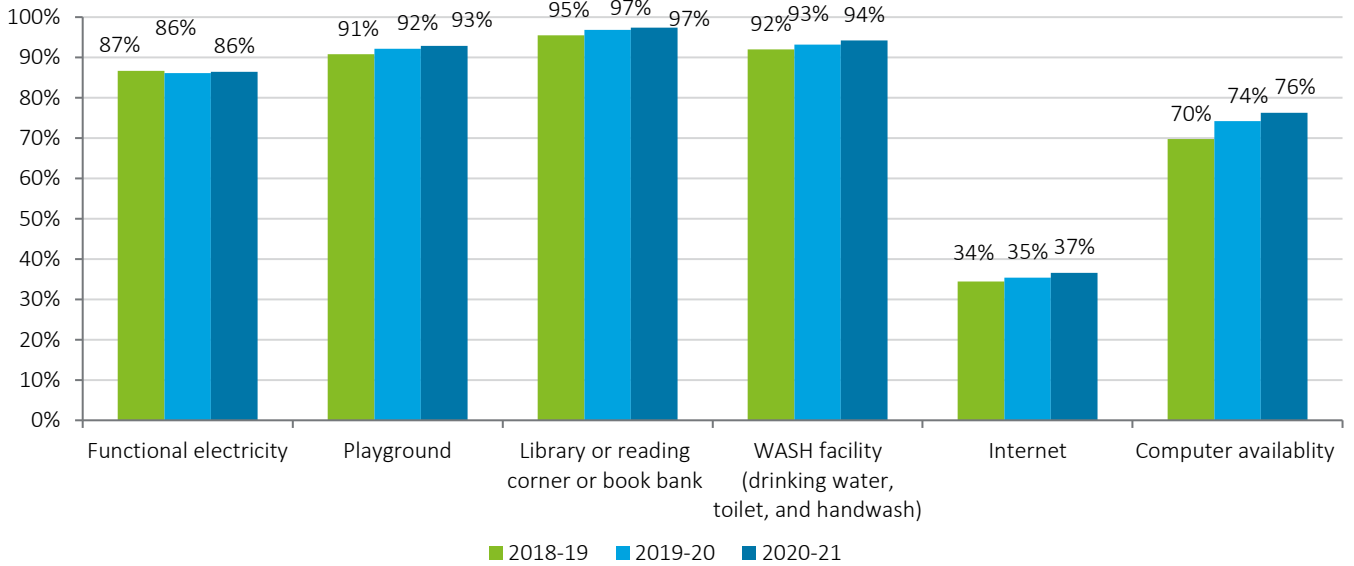

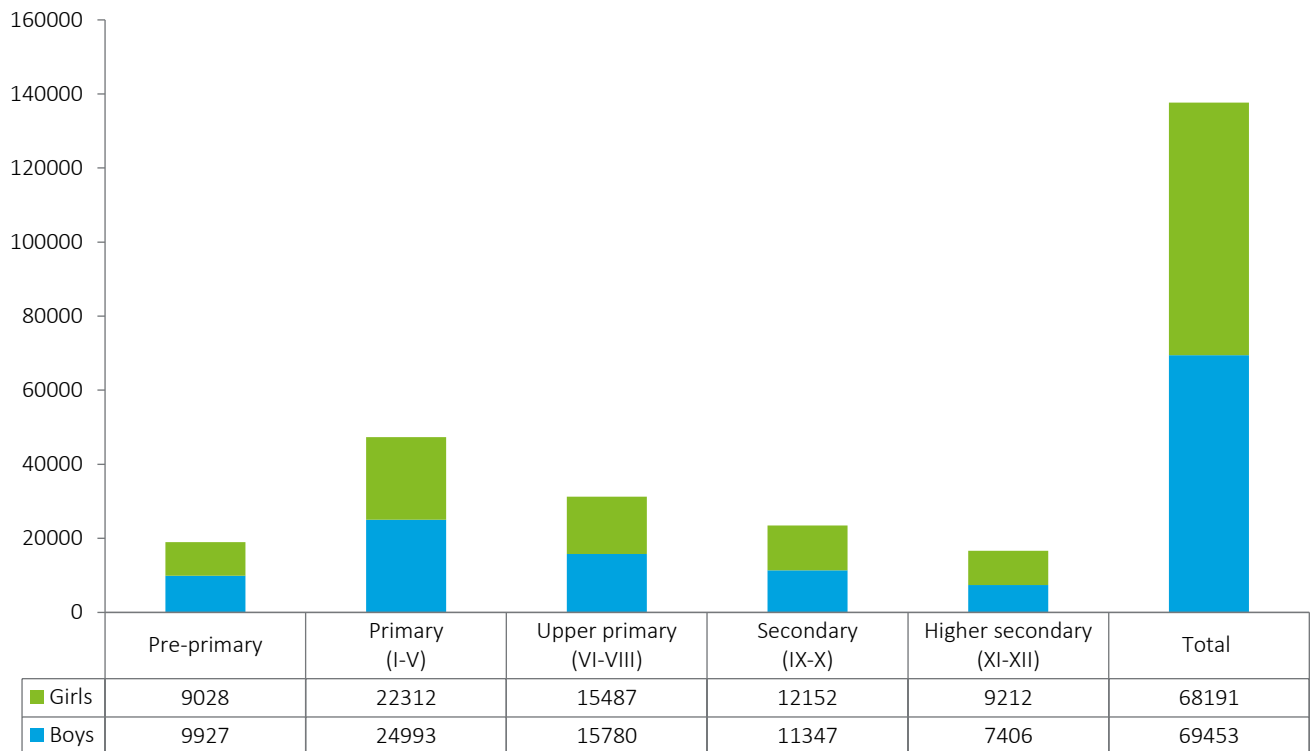

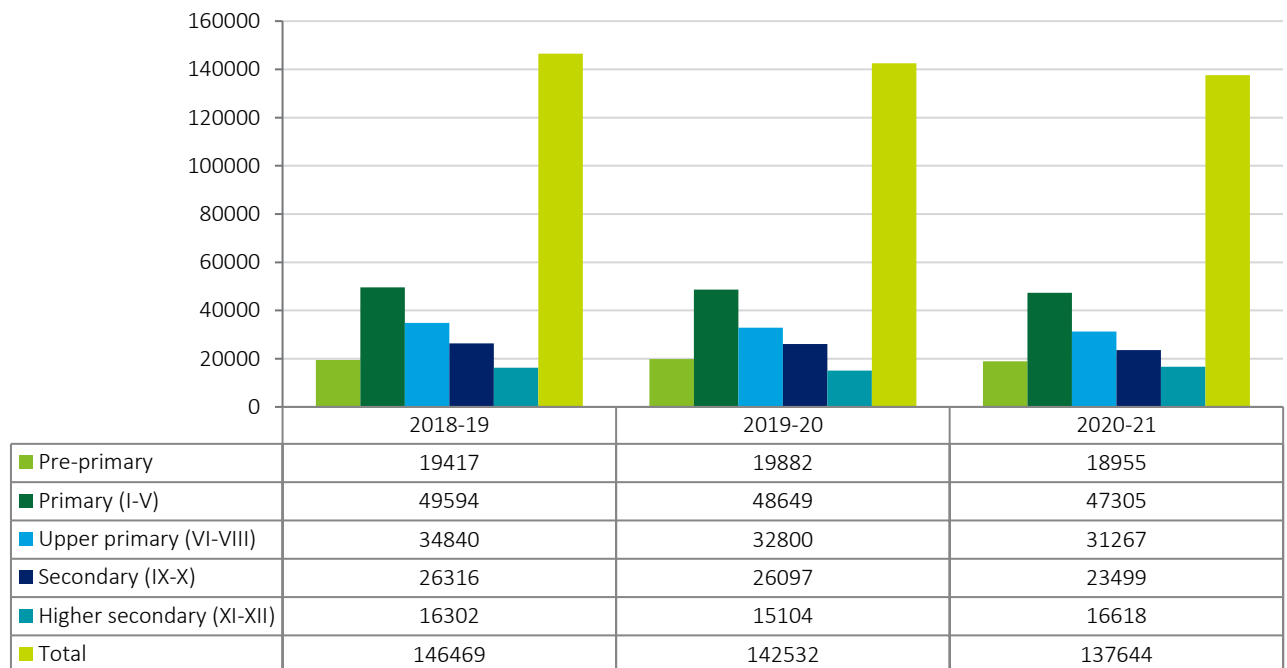

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



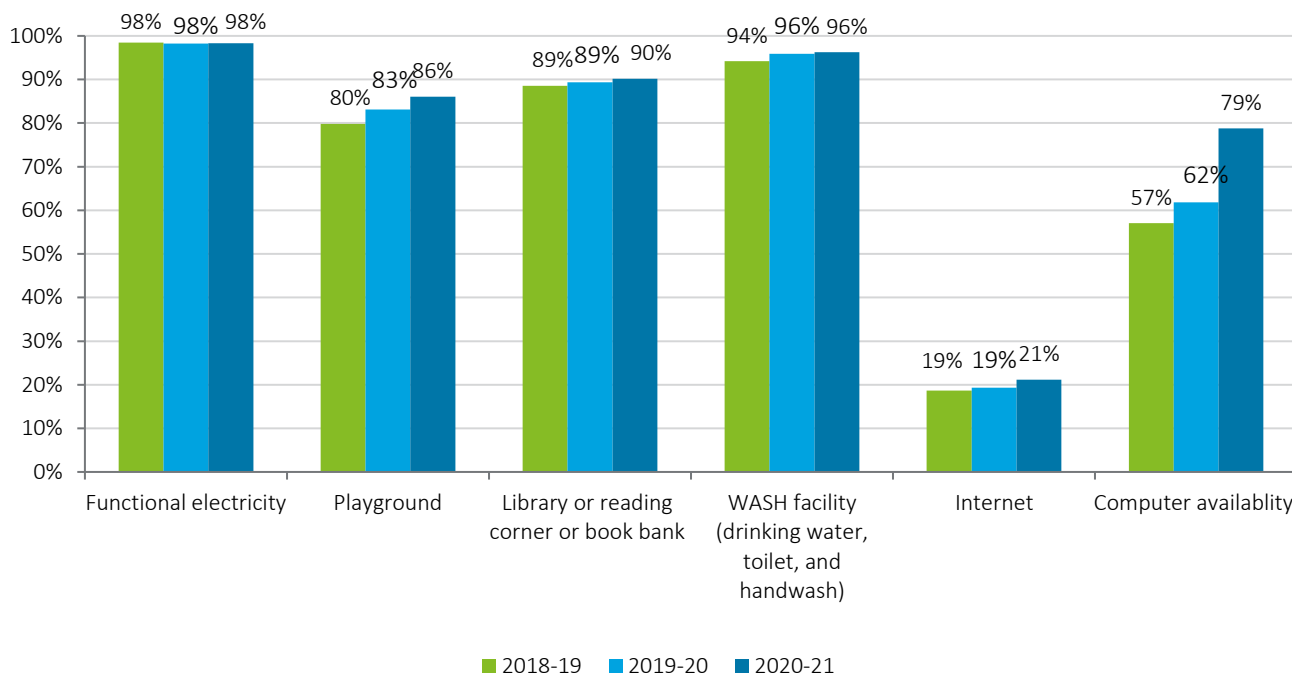

Enrolment by education level during the past three years



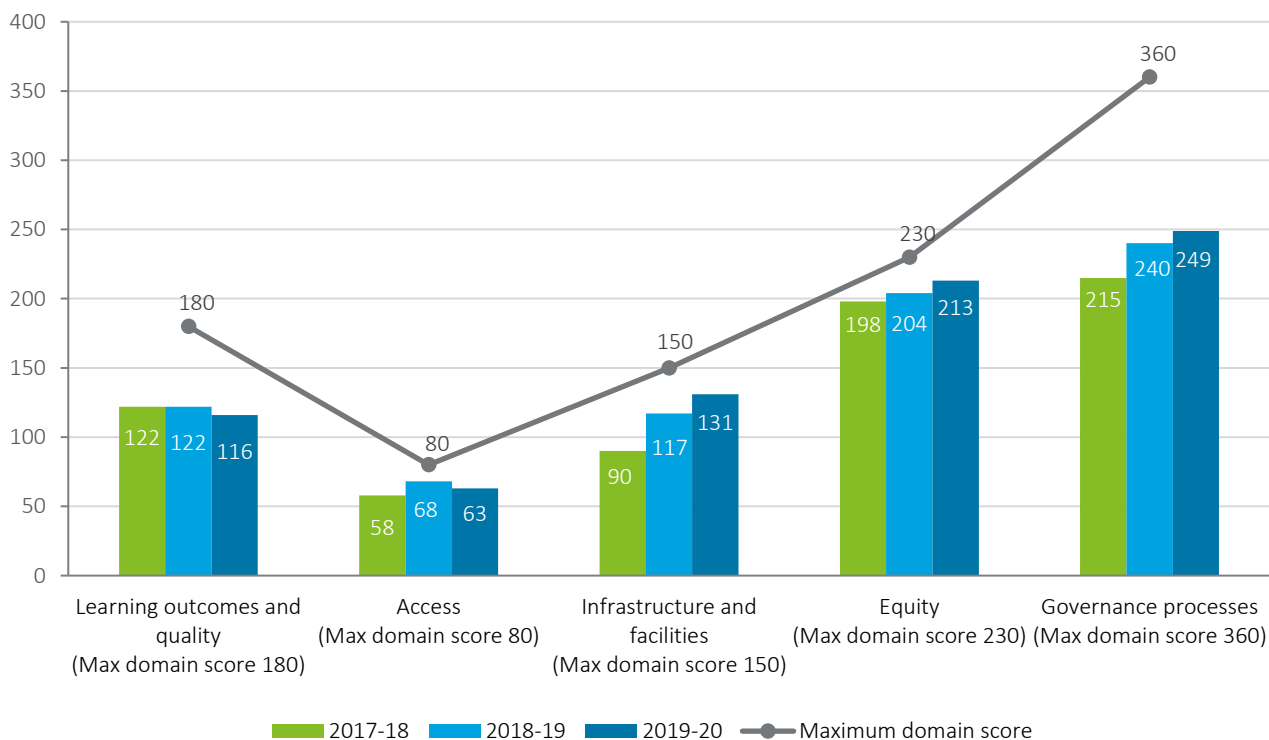

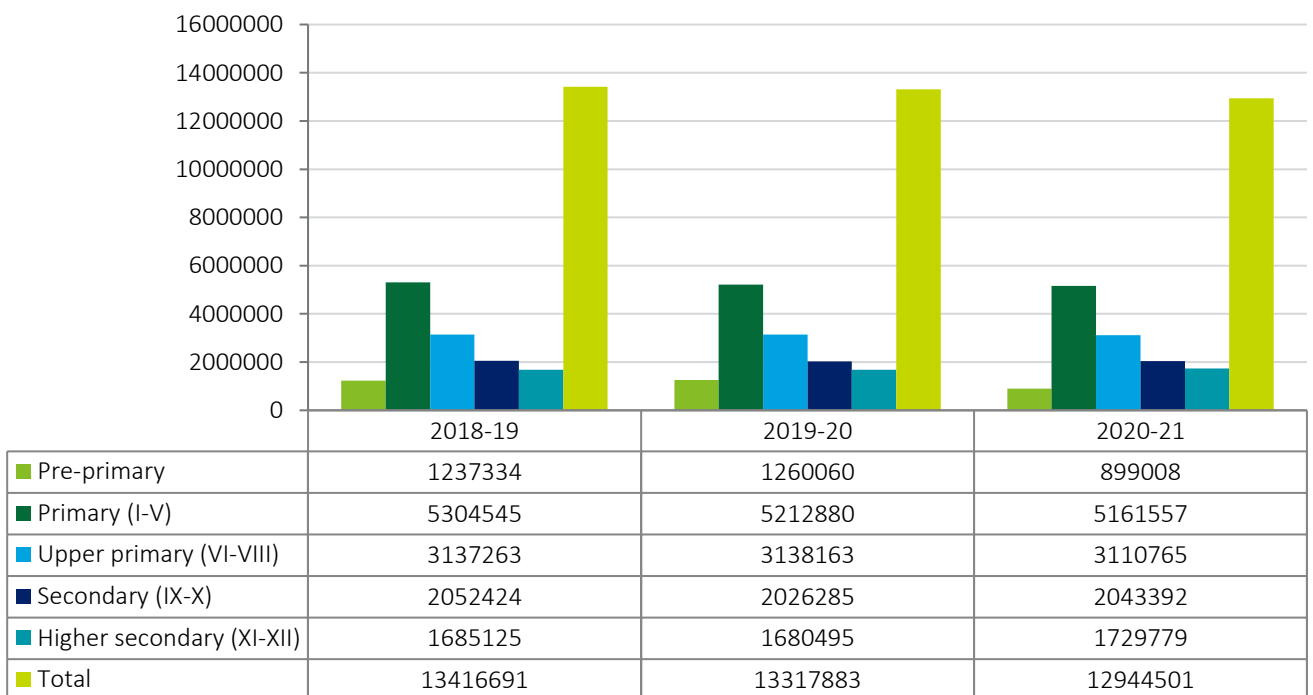

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



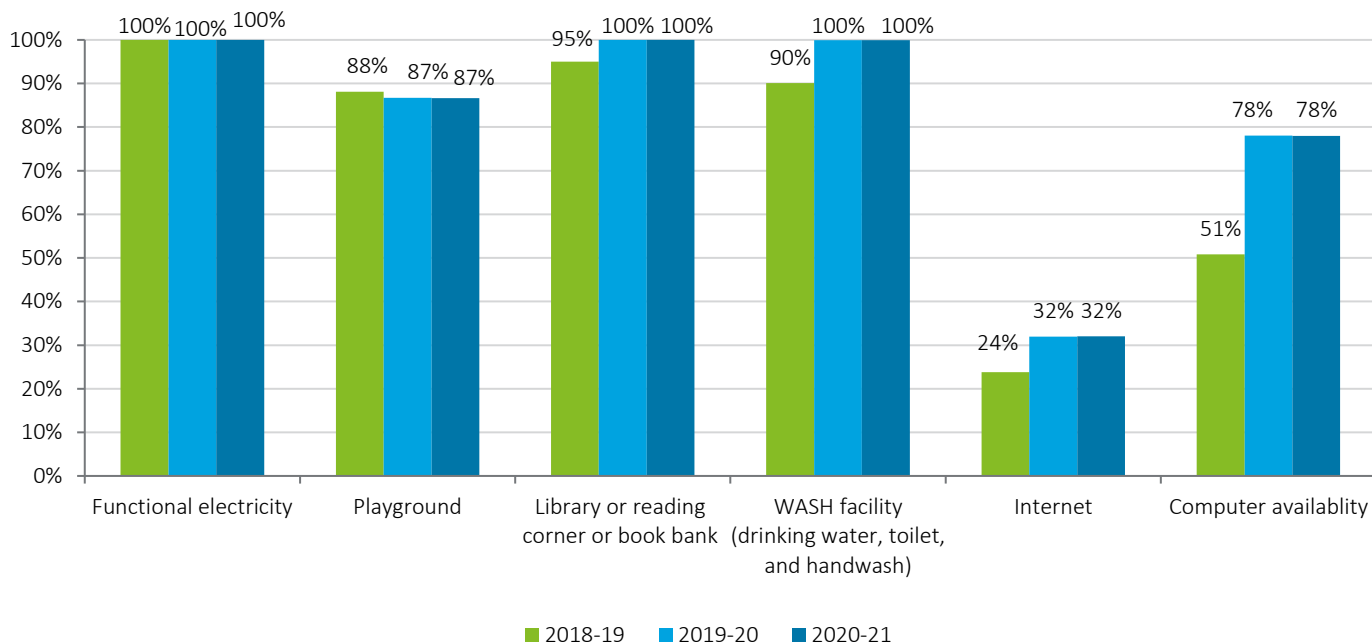

Enrolment by education level during the past three years



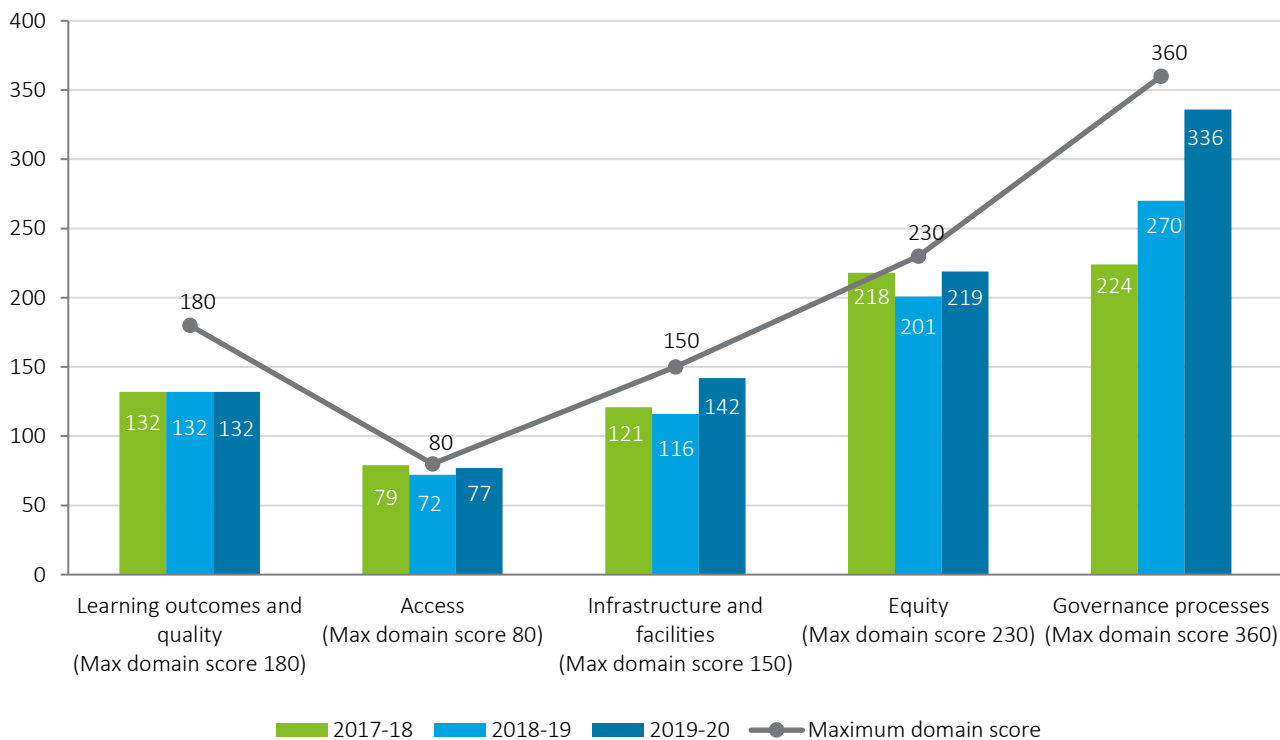

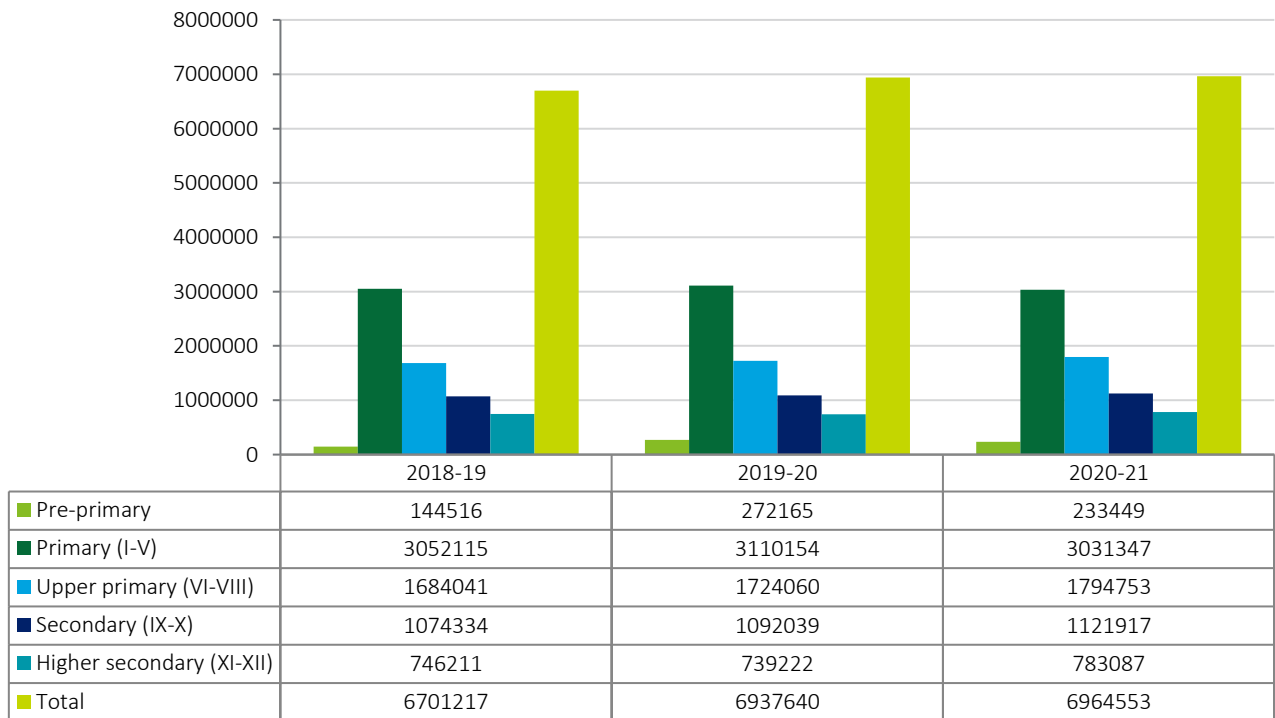

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



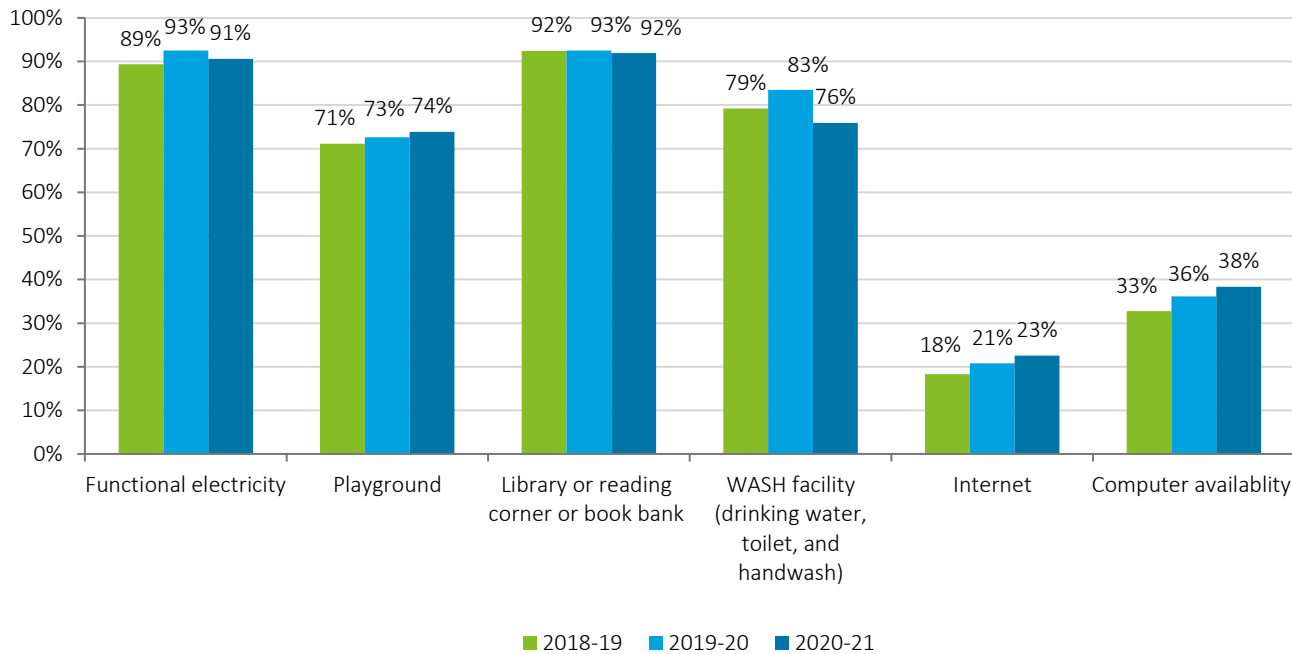

Enrolment by education level during the past three years



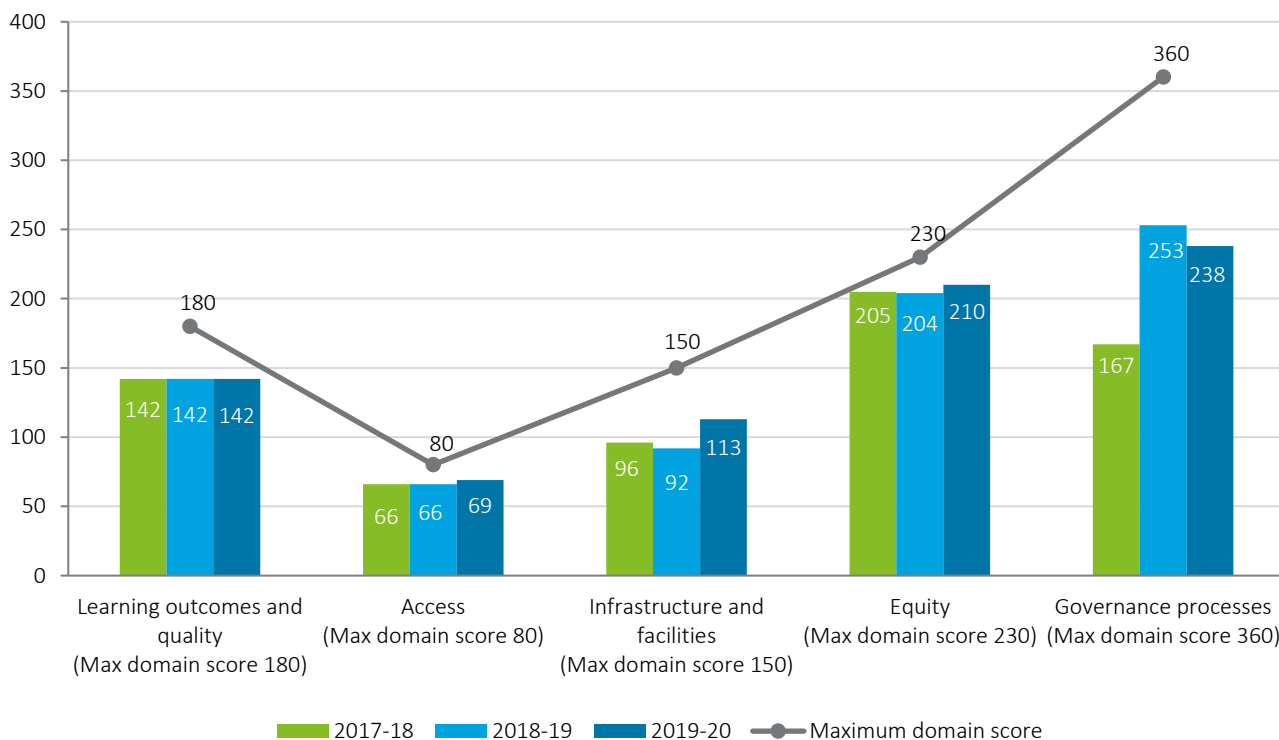

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



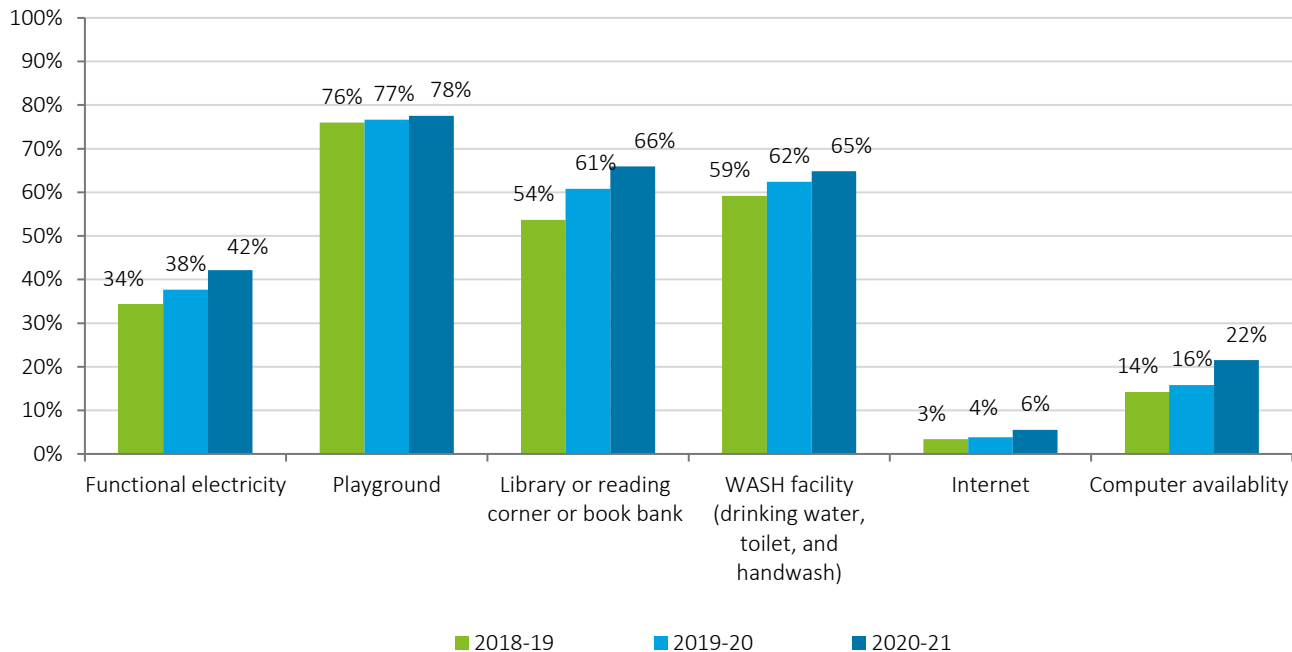

Enrolment by education level during the past three years



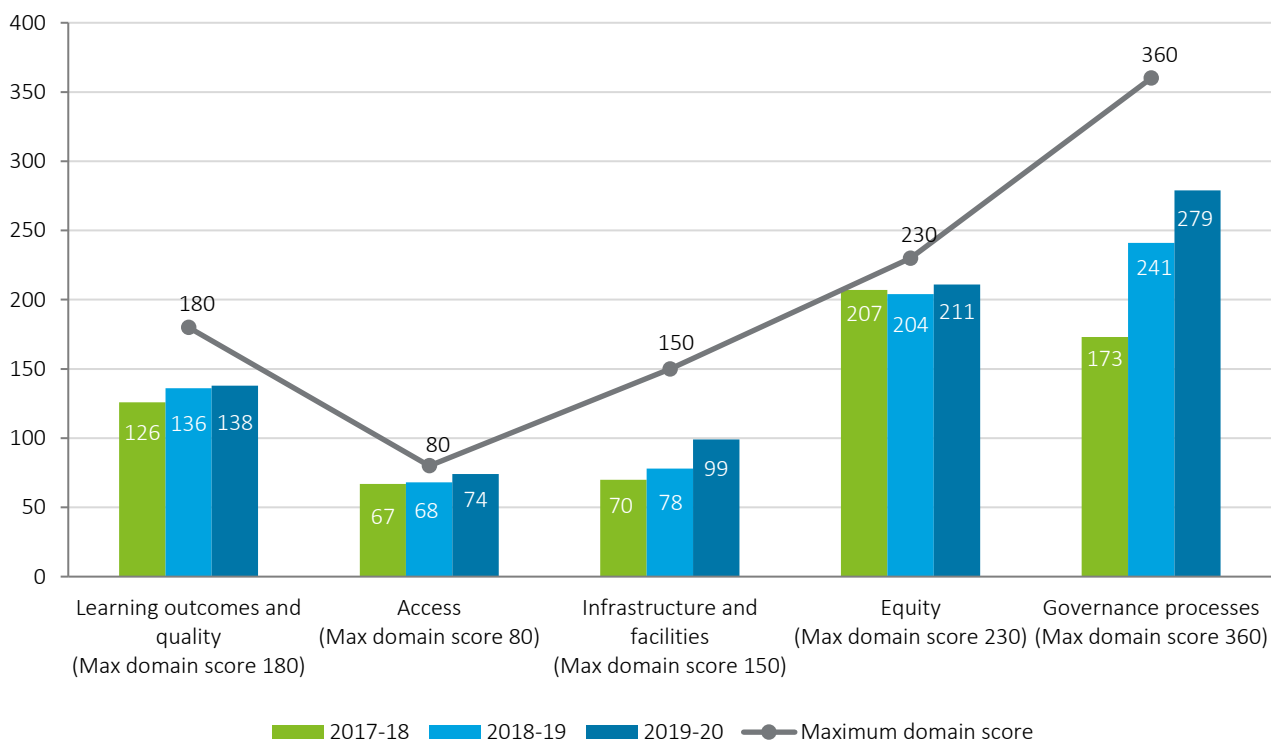

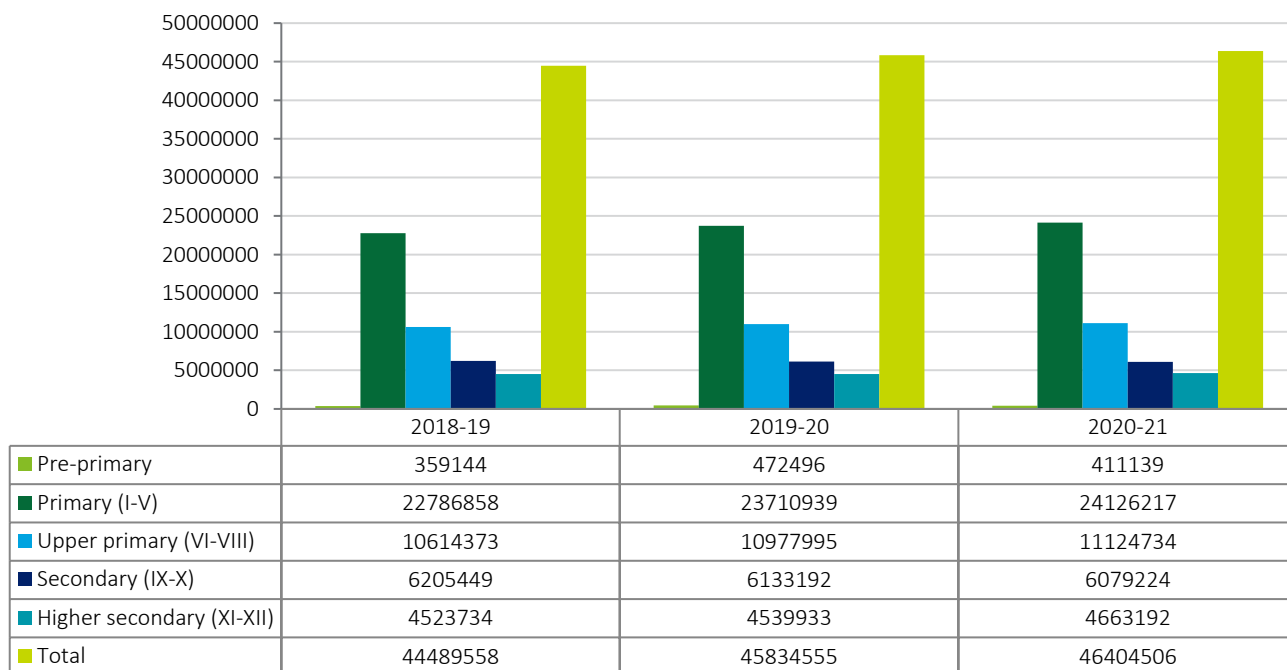

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



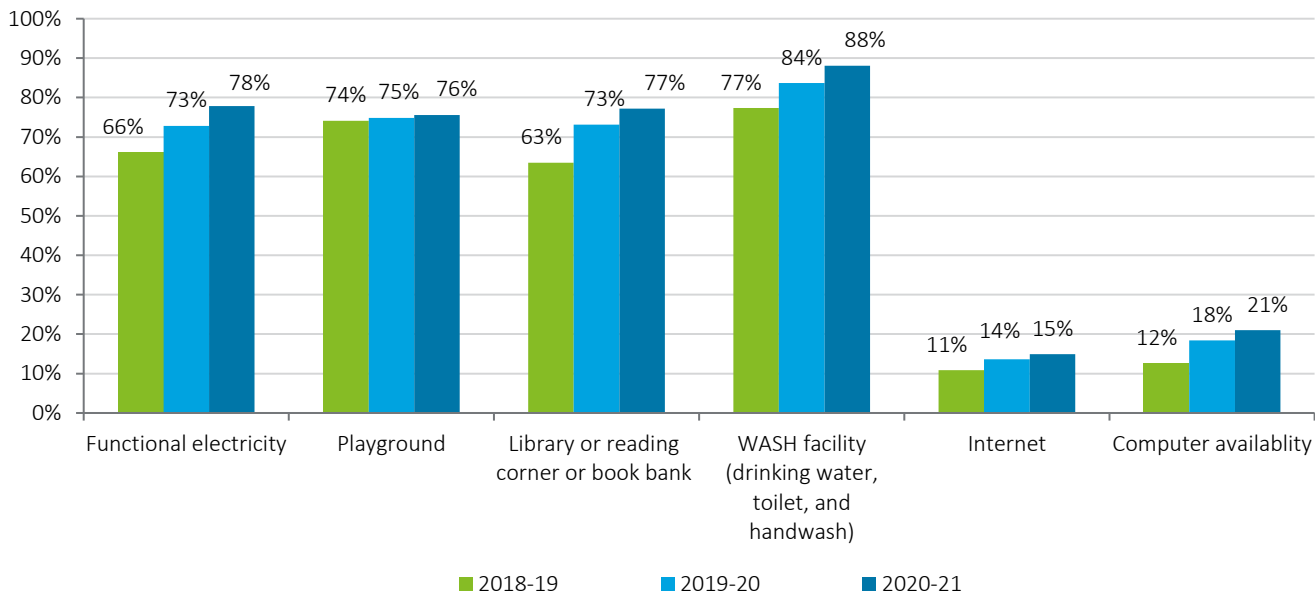

Enrolment by education level during the past three years



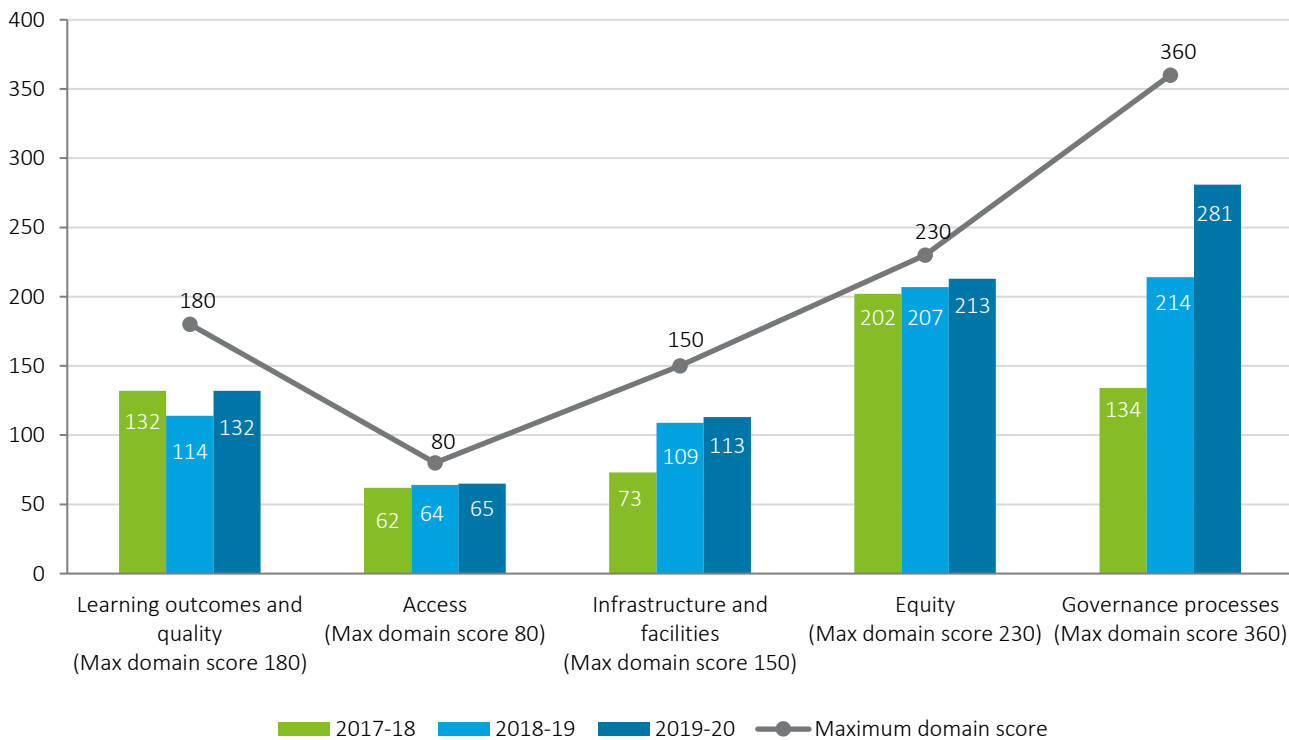

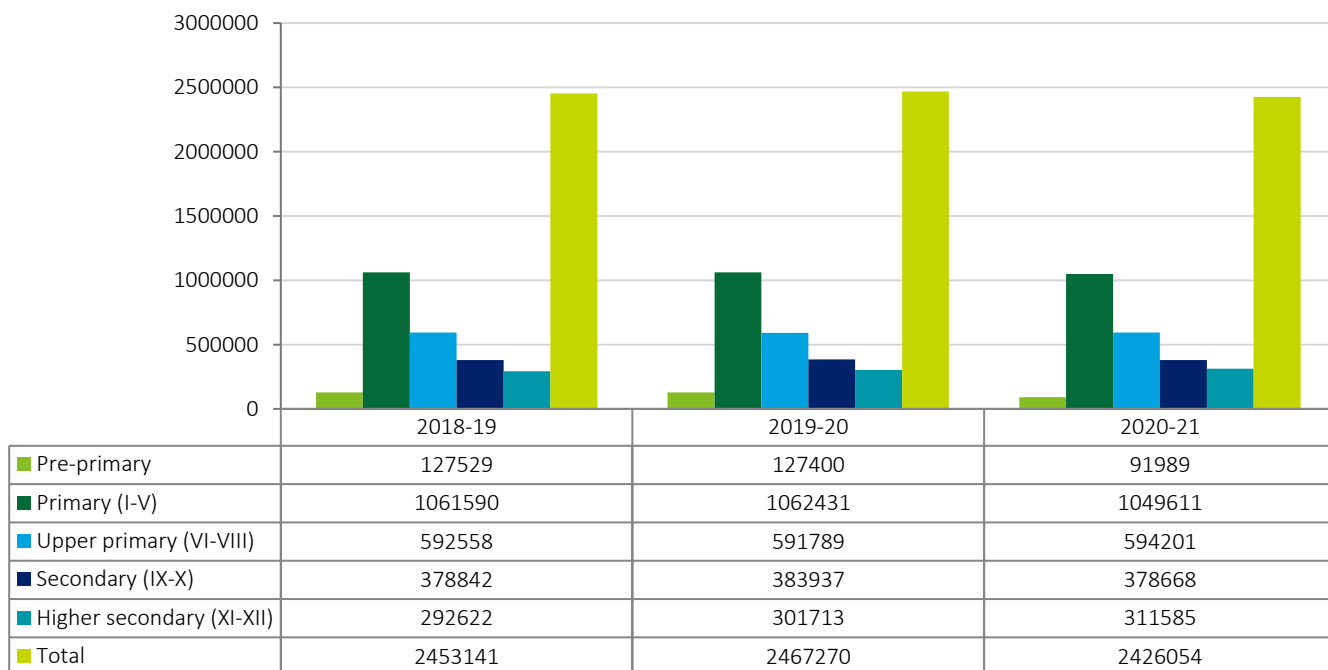

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



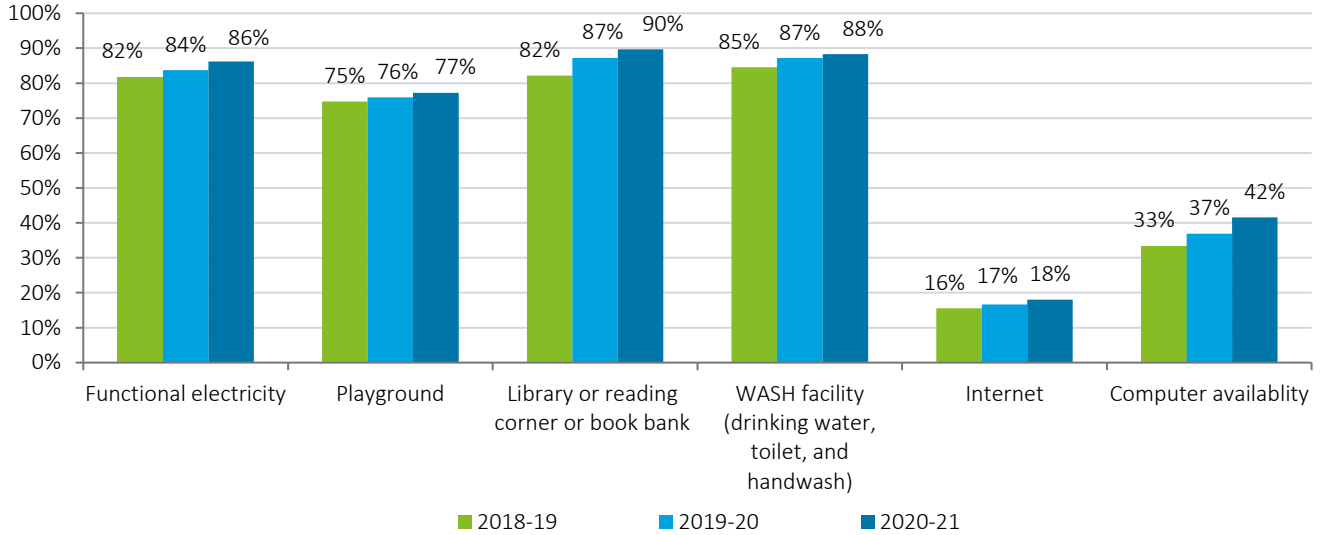

Enrolment by education level during the past three years



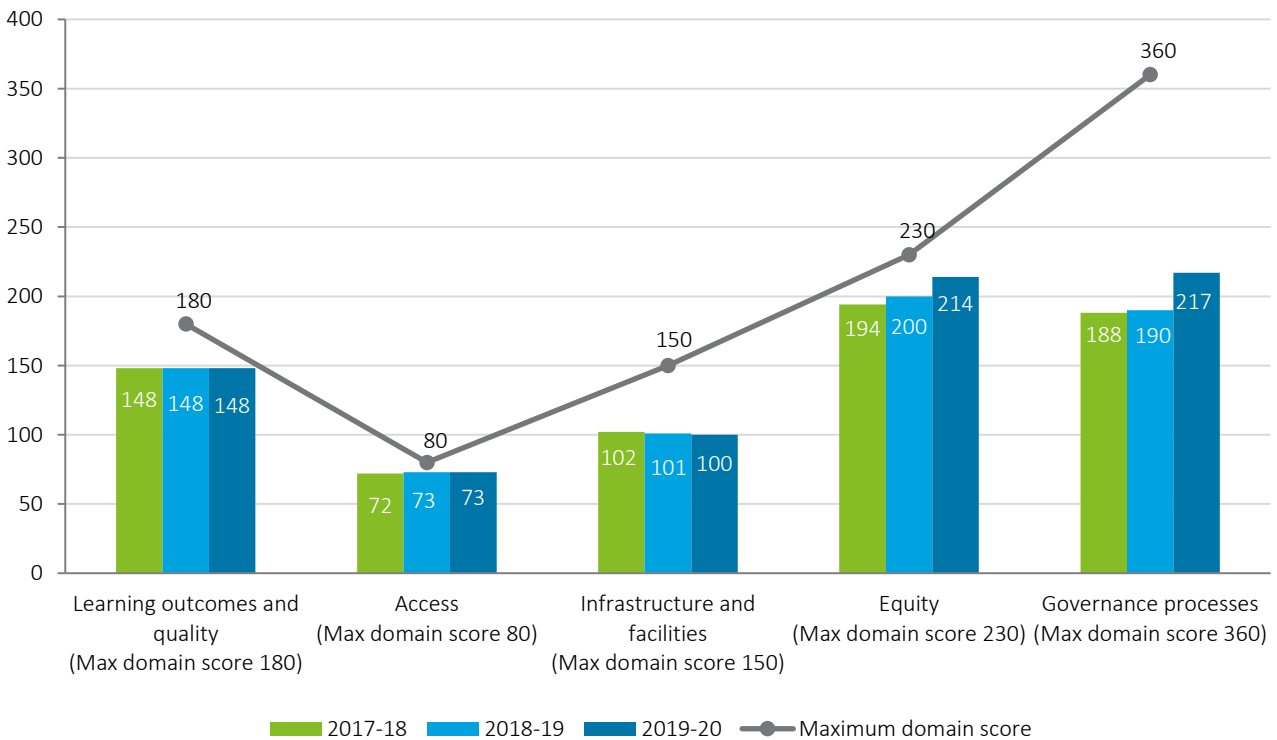

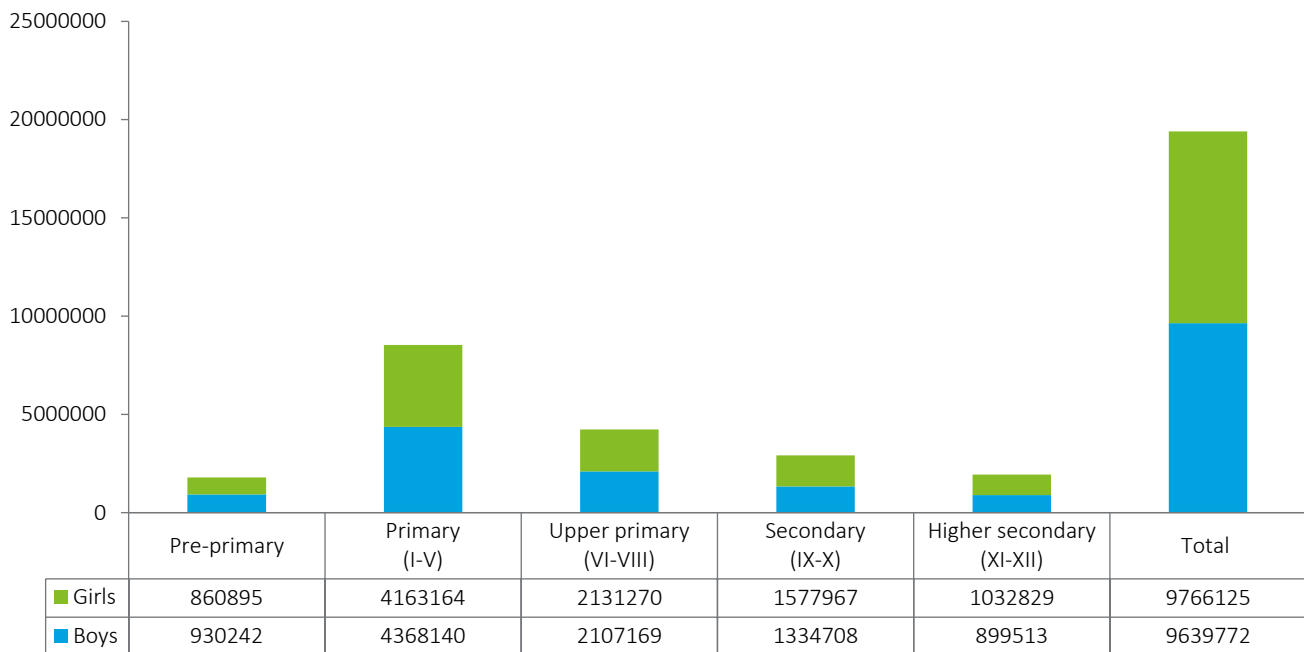

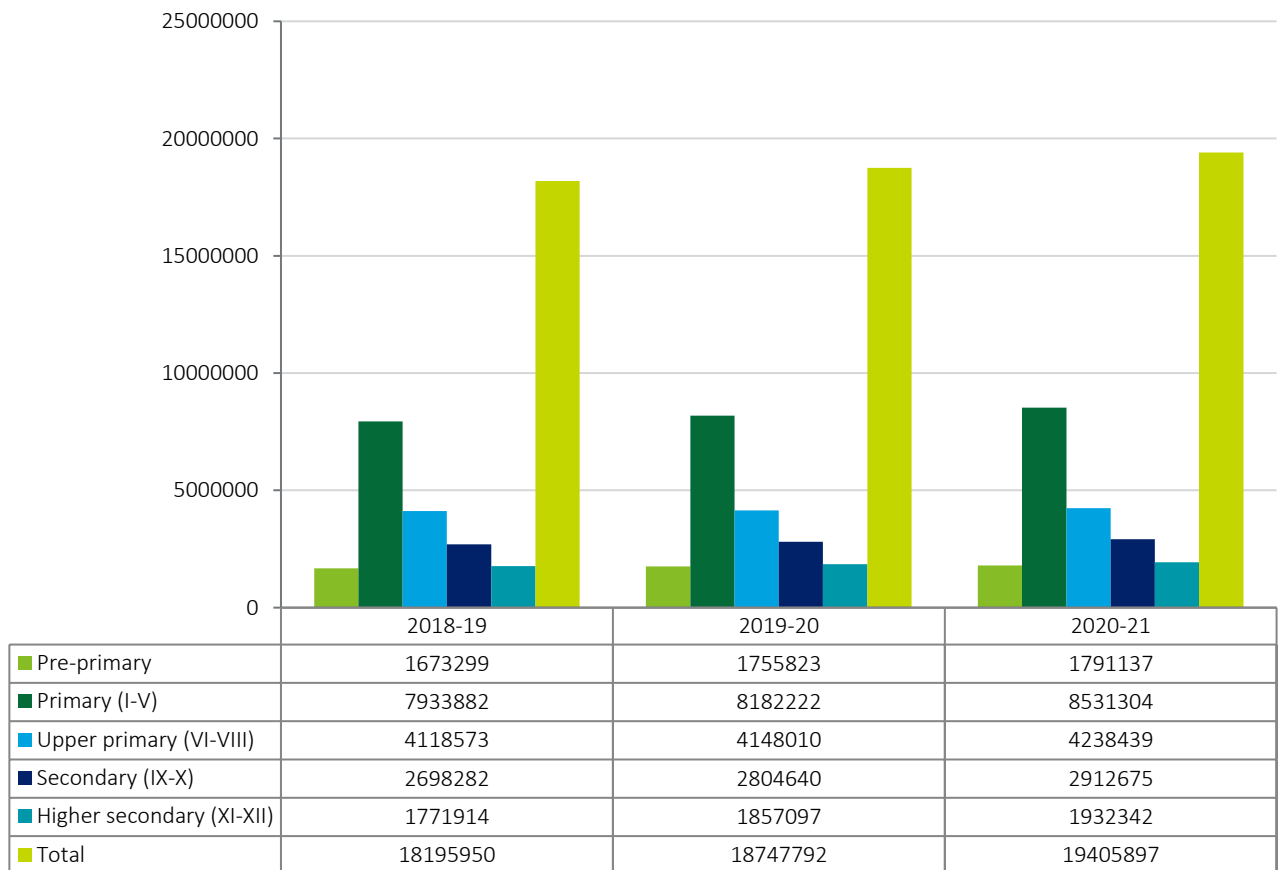

Enrolment by education level (2020-21)



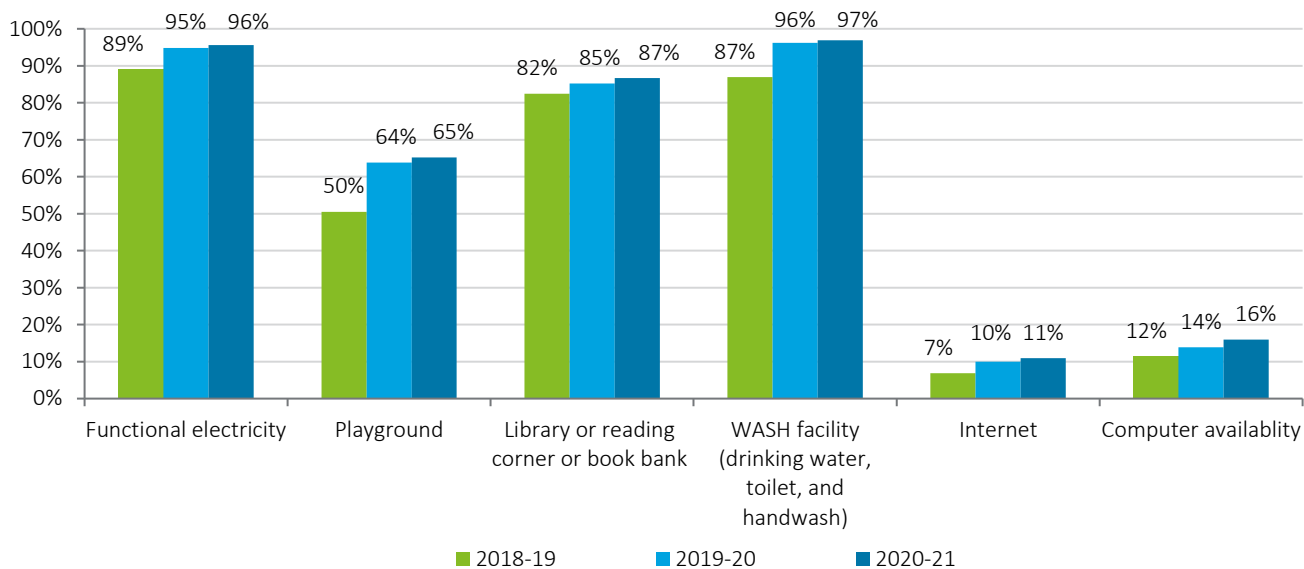

Enrolment by education level during the past three years



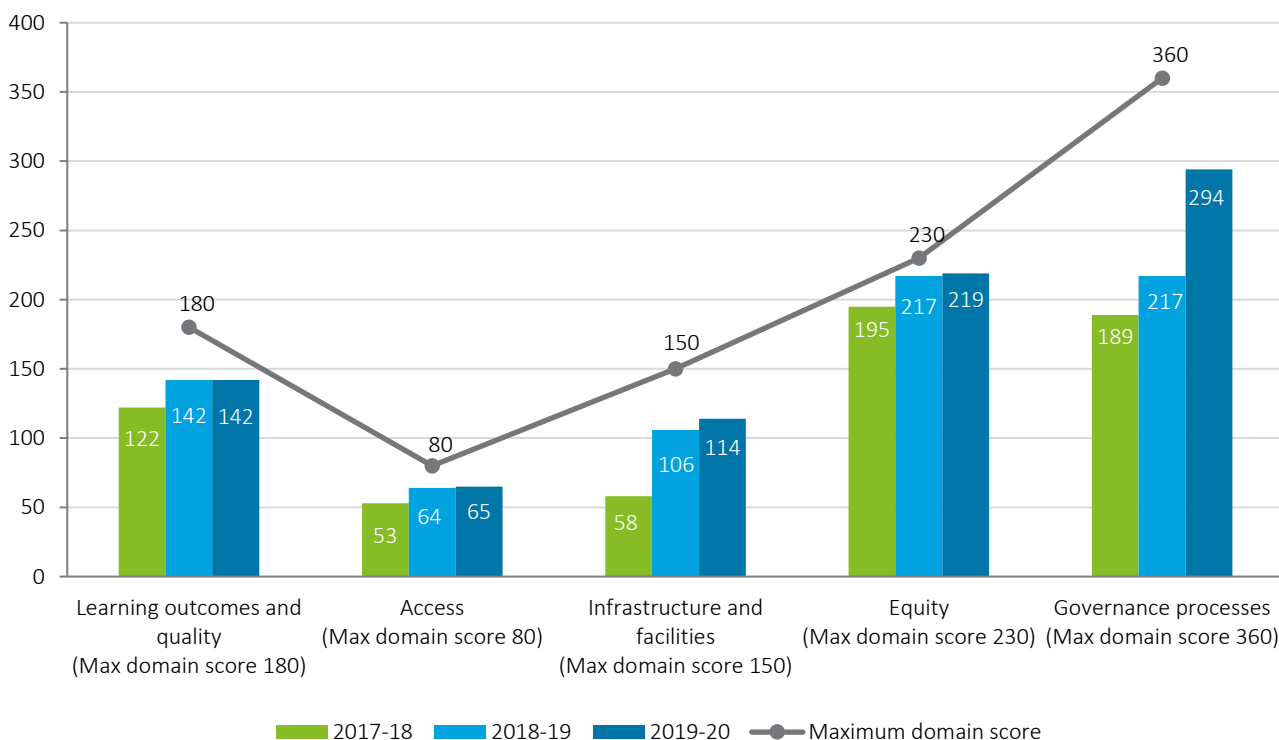
