



Portfolio Management

Respondents that manage projects under a single portfolio saw improvements in:

- Implementation and technology quality
- Stakeholder engagement
- Controls and integration
- Security management
- Consistency and time to integration

Cloud Computing

Surveyed companies that use cloud saw greater benefits than those with mixed stacks, including:

- Faster infrastructure changes
- Improved end-user experience
- Increased top-end processing speed Better customer experience and service
- Improved ROI
- Cost reduction typically not a benefit



SaaS

Software as a Service (SaaS) offered respondents benefits, such as:

- Easier updates
- Integration with existing technologies Improved ROI



Mobile

Full mobile deployment suggested significant benefits for respondents, including:

- Increased adoption of BYOD programs and policy
- Greater appeal to multiple generations of users

• Greater capacity for virtual work

· Necessary training sometimes overlooked



Agile Maturity

Companies using Agile methods for all IT projects saw implementation improvements in various areas, such as:

- Quality
- Speed
- Resourcing
- · Faster results in short sprints
- Better team focus on productivity

Digital Maturity

Respondents that had activated their Digital Enterprise were more effective in:

- Appealing to multigenerational users
- Organizational change
- Key interactions with customers
