
OPPORTUNITIES TO EXPAND THE USE OF COMPREHENSIVE CARE TEAMS


A multidisciplinary approach to patient care can improve the quality of care, enhance the patient experience, and contribute to better clinician well-being.

COMPREHENSIVE CARE TEAMS CAN BE HIGHLY COLLABORATIVE




YET, CURRENT UPTAKE OF COMPREHENSIVE CARE TEAMS IS LOW

Except for traditional inpatient care, use of comprehensive care teams is low.



EVOLVING THE BASIC CARE TEAM INTO A COMPREHENSIVE CARE TEAM



Physicians say comprehensive care teams could improve care delivery and patient outcomes.

37% want social workers and behavioral health providers

34%

want community-based organizations that provide social services

31%

want care managers with strong clinical backgrounds
