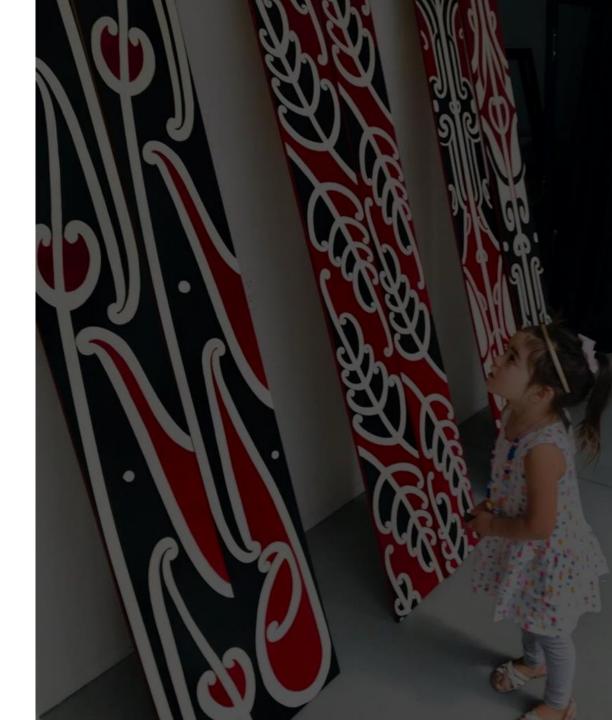
Noho Marae Experience
