

Olympic Gold Medallist Ellesse Andrews joins Deloitte partner James Arlidge to discuss performance, resilience and growth.

Ellesse Andrews MNZM is a New Zealand racing cyclist. She represented New Zealand at the 2018 Commonwealth Games and the 2020 Summer Olympics, where she gained a silver medal in the keirin. At the 2024 Summer Olympics, she earned two gold medals for winning the keirin and sprint, as well as a silver medal in the team sprint becoming the second women behind Dame Lisa Carrington to win 3 Olympic medals at a single games.
