## Japan

### Relaxation of border controls for passengers from China

With effect from 1 March 2023, Japan will ease COVID-19 restrictions on travellers from China. Instead of a blanket on-arrival testing of travellers, Japan will only test selected samples, although travellers will still need to show a negative test result before boarding flights to Japan. Passengers from Hong Kong and Macau will be exempt from any on-arrival testing or pre-boarding negative test requirements.

## Myanmar

### Updated public health requirements for travellers entering Myanmar through international commercial flights

The Ministry of Health has updated the public health requirements for travellers entering Myanmar through international commercial flights. Under the latest requirements, foreign travellers must hold a COVID-19 medical insurance policy purchased from Myanmar Insurance. However, business travellers who are operating in and out of Myanmar may be exempted from this health insurance requirement if they are able to submit proof of purchase for an insurance policy with COVID-19 health coverage from recognised insurance companies.

## South Korea

### Removal of post-arrival COVID-19 testing requirement for travellers from China

Effective 1 March 2023, South Korea will remove the post-arrival COVID-19 polymerase chain reaction testing requirement, and resume entry through airports other than Incheon International Airport for travellers from China. However, mandatory COVID-19

testing before departure for passengers from China will remain in place until 10 March 2023.


