CHAIRPERSON

Mr Vaughan Neil Strawbridge, one of the Joint and Several Administrators declared the meeting open at 10:00 AM (AEST).

Mr Strawbridge welcomed those in attendance to the Second meeting of Creditors of Virgin Australia Holdings Limited and the 40 subsidiaries subject to Voluntary Administration (the **Companies** or **Virgin Group**).

Mr Strawbridge introduced himself as one of the four (4) Joint and Several Administrators of the Companies and advised he would act as Chairperson of the meetings pursuant to rule 75-50 of the *Insolvency Practice Rules (Corporations) 2016 (IPR)*.

The Chairperson introduced:

- Messrs Sal Algeri, Richard Hughes and John Greig, his fellow Joint and Several Administrators who were in attendance virtually;
- Mr Timothy Sacker of Clayton Utz and members of his team, who were engaged as legal counsel for the Administrators; and
- advised that various other members of Deloitte staff working on the Voluntary Administrations were also in attendance virtually.

NON-CREDITORS OR OBSERVERS

The Chairperson asked that any members who had not registered in the capacity as either a creditor or observer exit the meeting immediately.

CONCURRENT MEETINGS OF CREDITORS

The Chairperson referred to the listing of 41 Virgin companies subject to Voluntary Administration which was displayed at the meeting and made available on the Voluntary Administrators website:
www.deloitte.com/au/virgin.

The Chairperson advised the meetings for the Companies would be held concurrently, as indicated by the Notice of the Second Meetings of Creditors dated 25 August 2020.

AGENDA AND CONDUCT OF THE MEETING

The Chairperson outlined the agenda for the meeting, as follows:

1. Procedural matters
2. Voluntary administration process
3. Events leading to appointment
4. Position on appointment
5. Administrators' actions
6. Sale of business process

7. Estimated return to creditors
8. Administrators opinion and Q&A
9. Voting on Resolutions

MEETING HELD VIRTUALLY

The Chairperson advised that due to the threat of the COVID-19 pandemic, under the government policy it would be inappropriate to convene a physical meeting. The Chairperson referred to recent interim amendments to the legislation that governed insolvency administrations and provided that meeting of creditors may be held virtually, using a technology that would give all persons entitled to attend a reasonable opportunity to participate without physically being present in the same place. The Chairperson noted the usage of Microsoft Teams Live Event platform for this purpose.

COURT ORDERS

The Chairperson referred to the application made to the Court on 23 April 2020 to seek among other things, that the Voluntary Administrators held meetings of creditors exclusively by video-link or telephone (and not in person) and to be able to issue any notices under sections 75-225(1) and 75-15 of **IPR** by:

- issuing the notice to a creditors email address;
- publishing on the Deloitte Virgin website: <http://www.deloitte.com/au/virgin>; and
- causing the notice to be published on the Australian Securities and Investments Commission (**ASIC**) published notices website at <https://insolvencynotices.asic.gov.au/>,

due to the COVID-19 pandemic which had restrictions on the movement and behaviour of people, and the cost of issuing such notices to creditors of the Voluntary Administrations, due to the significant amount of creditors.

In addition, the Chairperson referred to the court orders obtained around the lodgement of proxy forms and claims and voting using the Deloitte Halo platform (**Halo**) which specified that:

- Any creditor who intends to vote at the second meeting (other than Bond Holders of US\$ denominated notes (**USD Noteholders**)) must register with Halo.
- Creditors must lodge claims, proxies and powers of attorney electronically via the Halo platform.
- The Voluntary Administrators were permitted to adjudicate on claims for voting purposes at the second meeting based on information submitted by creditors via the Halo platform.
- The Voluntary Administrators were permitted to use the Halo platform for communications to creditors in respect of the conduct of the Administration and creditor claims (includes USD Noteholders).

The Chairperson noted that creditors who have not voted, would be asked to during the meeting to log on to Halo to vote and referred to the Halo guide located in the Report to Creditors (**the Report**) dated 25 August 2020 which detailed the process to vote.

Q&A FUNCTION

The Chairperson advised that the Microsoft Teams Live Events technology, together with Halo, gave all participants a reasonable opportunity to participate in a vote taken at the meeting and to ask questions without being physically present.

The Chairperson advised that there was a Q&A function that allows participants to ask questions and that he would advise when this function was activated.

The Chairperson apologised that the limitations of the Teams Live Event was that questions could only be submitted in the Q&A function. The Chairperson advised the Teams Live Event was being utilised due to the number of attendee's present. The Chairperson noted that during the course of the meeting he would endeavour to answer as many questions as possible and may consolidate the response to similar questions that overlap and/or duplicate. The Chairperson noted that any questions not answered during the meeting, would be done so via FAQs posted on the Voluntary Administrators website, noting that this had occurred for questions received prior to the meeting.

The Chairperson noted that only creditors were entitled to ask questions or to propose resolutions. Persons who were attending as observers could not do so.

RESOLUTIONS RESOLVED BY POLL

The Chairperson noted the meeting was being conducted in accordance with *Corporations (Coronavirus Economic Response) Determination (No. 1) 2020* and the guidelines established by ASIC for holding meetings during COVID-19 restrictions. The Chairperson noted that the interim legislation that was introduced to facilitate virtual meetings specifies that all resolutions must be resolved on a poll and detailed the process for which a poll was carried under IPR 75-115(1).

The Chairperson noted as Chairperson under IPR 75-115(3), he had the power to exercise a "casting vote" if no result was reached for or against a resolution on a poll except where the resolution concerns the remuneration or removal of the administrators. The Chairperson noted that should the circumstance arise he would inform the meeting of the reasons as appropriate.

NOTICE OF MEETING

The Chairperson advised that the meeting had been called in accordance with the notice of meeting dated 25 August 2020, as advertised in the ASIC Notices web site on 25 August 2020. The Chairperson noted that the notice of meeting and the Report dated 25 August 2020 was sent to creditors by email on 25 August 2020.

DECLARATION OF CONVENIENCE

The Chairperson advised that the Administrators had not received any objections to the time of the meetings or to the meetings being held concurrently, and declared the meetings were being held at a date, time and place convenient to the majority of persons entitled to receive notice of the meetings in accordance with IPR 75-30.

ATTENDANCE REGISTER

The Chairperson advised that a record would be taken using the Microsoft Teams technology of all the people logged into the meeting for the purposes of the attendance register, that would be attached to the minutes of meeting and subsequently lodged with ASIC.

The Chairperson advised that the Administrators had received more than five thousand (5,000) proxies for creditors of the Companies for which the concurrent meeting was held as well as two thousand (2,000) registered to attend.

The Chairperson noted, given the significant number of proxies received, it was impractical to read them out to the meeting. The Chairperson noted the proxies would be disclosed in the minutes to the meeting.

QUORUM

The Chairperson declared a quorum was present for each of the Meetings of Creditors of the Companies in accordance with the requirements pursuant to IPR 75-105.

DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE, RELEVANT RELATIONSHIPS AND INDEMNITIES

The Chairperson noted that a Declaration of Independence, Indemnities & Relevant Relationships (**DIRRI**) dated 20 April 2020 was provided with the Initial Notice to Creditors on 21 April 2020. The Chairperson noted that since the signing of the initial DIRRI, the Administrators were appointed to three (3) additional Virgin Group entities. To that end, the Chairperson advised that an updated DIRRI was provided in the Report and further clarified that the Administrators do not consider that the changes made have/would cause a real or potential risk to the Administrators independence.

TABLING OF DOCUMENTS

The Chairperson tabled the following documents:

- Notice of Meeting of Creditors dated 25 August 2020
- Advertisement on the ASIC Insolvency Notices website dated 25 August 2020
- Updated DIRRI dated 21 August 2020
- Report to Creditors pursuant to IPR 75-225 dated 25 August 2020
- The Statement in Writing of Posting of Notice of Meeting dated 25 August 2020.

VOLUNTARY ADMINISTRATION PROCESS AND PURPOSE

The Chairperson provided a recap of the voluntary administration process.

The Chairperson before discussing the process of the voluntary administration acknowledged and thanked everyone who was instrumental to enabling the current status of the Voluntary Administration of the Companies. The Chairperson thanked the Virgin Management team and Virgin staff and recognised the difficult circumstances they had continued to work under, and the patience all staff had shown while on stand down from normal operations and touched on the amazing culture at Virgin which continued to shine. The Chairperson proceeded to thank the unions, lessors and financiers, service providers and the federal government for the industry support package and for under writing certain key flights which was essential to operations.

The Chairperson noted the intention of the voluntary administration process was to maximise the prospects of a company, or as much as possible of its business, continuing in existence, or, if that were not possible, then to achieve better returns to creditors than what would have been achieved by its immediate liquidation. The Chairperson referred to the Australian law which provided administrators with the powers to sell assets and or the business at any time without court orders or consultation with creditors.

The Chairperson detailed the usual course of a sale process to determine the current “value” of the business based on the circumstances prevalent at the time, noting a sale was usually completed by either an Asset Sale Agreement (**ASA**) or restructuring of a business within the existing legal entity structure, by way of a Deed of Company Arrangement (**DOCA**). The Chairperson noted that in the event a DOCA was proposed, creditors would need to vote on the DOCA at the second meeting of creditors.

The Chairperson noted that in respect of the Companies, what had been agreed with Bain Capital (**Bain**) was a sale to be completed via an ASA unless creditors agree to the completion of the sale via a DOCA whilst noting the Administrators exercised their statutory power of sale to achieve this.

The Chairperson noted the significant benefit in cost savings, structuring complexity and timing in completing a sale using a DOCA for an airline, and that the benefit of which under the proposed DOCA would be shared with creditors via an enhanced return.

The Chairperson advised the main purpose of the Meeting was for the creditors to resolve whether:

- the Companies should execute a DOCA proposed by Bain, as specified in the Report; or
- the Administrations should end; or
- the Companies should be wound up.

The Chairperson then advised the Administrators’ opinion was that it was in the creditors’ interests to approve the DOCAs proposed by Bain.

EVENTS LEADING TO APPOINTMENT AND POSITION ON APPOINTMENT

The Chairperson noted that he would not go through the entirety of the Report, rather provided a summary of key points addressed which were important regarding the decisions being made and the return creditors expected to receive under the options available for the future of the Companies.

The Chairperson noted the drastic reduction in capacity at which the business was operating due to the travel restrictions imposed by the Government in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, which led to the appointment of the Administrators.

The Chairperson noted that upon the Administrators appointment, the Administrators took immediate steps, working with management to maintain the Group’s operations as a going concern, albeit at a much smaller scale, to preserve the value of the business and maximise optionality through a sale process. The Chairperson touched on the reduction in operating capacity in comparison to the previous year and working alongside management the Administrators were able to significantly reduce the holding and trading costs of the business, mainly due to the support of stakeholders who were critical to the continued operation of the airline.

The Chairperson noted that the current operating levels was not sustainable given the overheads of the business. The Chairperson gave reference to the current climate in a COVID 19 landscape, including the travel restrictions and state border closures which continued to hamper profitable segments of the business.

The Chairperson touched on announcements made by the main competitor of Virgin, being Qantas, in respect to losses suffered and a number of redundancies, whilst noted the recovery of the travel sector was expected to take longer and its impact much greater than first anticipated.

The Chairperson detailed the monthly cash burn rate due to the reduced flying and revenue being generated, whilst noting the reduction of cash burn rate was critical to enabling time for the Administrators to seek a sale and avoid ceasing to operate.

The Chairperson detailed the cash at bank on appointment, whilst referencing the Report section that detailed the reduction in the cash at bank due to the ability of financiers to off-set funds against their exposures.

The Chairperson noted that under Australian law employees had a priority over certain asset recoveries which included cash at bank. The Chairperson advised that the Administrators were effectively using assets which would have otherwise been available to pay employee entitlements, to trade the business with the hope of achieving a better outcome for all creditors. The Chairperson noted the significant issue and risk associated with trading the business in the event a sale was not achieved.

The Chairperson noted the Administrators did not have the luxury of trading profits as the industry was in unprecedented free fall, with significant losses incurred. The Chairperson noted, management and the board had sought funding from the Government to fund the business and avoid any insolvency. However, none was forthcoming from either the Government, shareholders or believed to be raised by the market in the time available. The Chairperson detailed the funding challenges and a position of no surplus assets that could be easily realised to trade funding.

ADMINISTRATORS' ACTIONS

The Chairperson noted in the initial period of the Administrators appointment, the Administrators sought to reduce the holding costs of the airline whilst noting the timeframe to do so without additional funding.

The Chairperson referenced Court orders which enabled the Administrators to defer some substantial costs which would otherwise have been incurred, whilst giving reference to negotiations surrounding aircraft protocol agreements with aircraft owners and lessors enabling a cash at bank position to trade to 30 June 2020. The Chairperson noted, although the Administrators were able to get to the cash position, it did not alleviate the fact the funds otherwise available to employee entitlements were almost depleted. However, this allowed time to conduct the sale program to maximise the chances of the airline continuing, maximising ongoing employment, creating optionality for the future of the airline whilst achieving a return to all creditors.

The Chairperson noted the position was only achieved with the support of the Government (by way of "Jobkeeper"), management, staff, financiers, service providers and other key stakeholders of the business working in unison.

The Chairperson noted the significant loss to people who had been hurt and impacted by the Administrations. The Chairperson thanked the Virgin employees that will be leaving Virgin as a result of the restructure.

The Chairperson noted the significant loss of jobs and investment across a broad range of stakeholders and shareholders.

SALE OF BUSINESS PROCESS

The Chairperson noted the formulation of the sale and recapitalisation process and the vital importance of an accelerated timetable given the lack of liquidity and unencumbered assets with a view to create competitive tension. The Chairperson noted the enhanced risk of the Companies entering liquidation under a walk away scenario.

The Chairperson proceeded to detail the three (3) distinct phases of the sale process which resulted in the shortlisting of two (2) parties with a culmination of final offers on 22 June 2020.

The Chairperson detailed the reasons for the Administrators' decision to exercise their power of sale and enter into a binding agreement with Bain during the Administration period, which included:

- Neither shortlisted party was willing to undertake any significant restructuring work or take on the economic risk for the trading of the business without certainty and under a binding agreement, the purchaser could engage in meaningful negotiations with the Companies' various contract counterparties;
- The significant cash constraints facing the business;
- The current and possible future impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the business; and
- The need to retain key customers, contracts, assets, employees and regulatory registrations and approvals to preserve the value of the business.

The Chairperson noted the importance of securing a binding transaction, with any delay in the process or uncertainty as to an outcome seriously affecting the prospects of the business continuing as a going concern.

The Chairperson then detailed the benefit achieved under the agreement with Bain, including:

- Certainty of continuation of trading
- An interim funding of \$125m
- Bain assuming economic trading risk from 1 July 2020
- Employee entitlements to be covered in full
- All travel credits/unearned revenue to be assumed in full
- The assumption of certain liabilities
- Cash contributions between \$447.2m to \$572.2m.

The Chairperson advised, in order to support and underpin the certainty of the transaction the Administrators received security in the form of a guarantee amounting to \$750m.

The Chairperson detailed the two (2) methods in which the Bain sale could occur being;

1. Asset sale agreement, involving the transfer of the business into a new corporate structure and placing the existing Companies into liquidation; or
2. Executing the DOCAs and transferring shares in Virgin Australia Holdings Limited (**VAH**) to Bain.

The Chairperson noted the more efficient and cost-effective way to complete the Bain sale transaction was via a DOCA.

STRUCTURE OF THE DOCAS

The Chairperson noted that Bain DOCA proposal involved ten (10) separate DOCAS covering all of the forty one (41) entities in voluntary administration and that the structure would allow the continued operations of the Virgin Group business with the majority of current employees retaining their employment and the preservation of their entitlements.

The Chairperson, utilising the Group structure presented during the meeting, identified the makeup of the ten (10) separate DOCAS, being:

1. Primary DOCA
2. International DOCA; and
3. 8 Subsidiary DOCAs

The Chairperson noted for the DOCAs to come into effect, the majority of creditors present at the second meeting of creditors for each of the entities, who also held the majority in value regarding their claims would need to pass a resolution voting in favour of the DOCAs. In the event the resolution was inconclusive, the Chairperson would utilise his casting vote.

The Chairperson detailed the entities which fall part of a DOCA groups noting four (4) entities in the International DOCA; twenty-eight (28) entities in the Primary DOCA and nine (9) entities across the eight (8) other DOCA's.

The Chairperson noted that as part of the process, it was proposed that all shares in VAH would be transferred to an entity nominated by Bain and this entity would become the 100% owner of VAH, with current shareholders receiving no consideration for this sale. The Chairperson advised that this process required an application to the Court.

The Chairperson noted that upon completion of transfer of the shares in VAH, the DOCAs would be complete and the proposed Creditor's Trust (**Creditors' Trust**) would be created for the sole purpose of dealing with the claims of the Companies creditors.

BAIN PROPOSAL OVERVIEW

The Chairperson noted that Bain's preferred option for completing the sale was via a DOCA structure, as the amount of consideration for the business was higher than that of an ASA as well as the costs of completing the sale under a DOCA being less than that of an ASA.

The Chairperson detailed the key terms and metrics of the Bain DOCA proposal, and the reasons that the DOCA proposal provides a better outcome of creditors being as follows:

- Provision of the full value of all travel credits and prepaid customer flights
- Provision of interim funding and acceptance of economic risk
- Continued employment for the majority of employees and pays out all other entitlements in full
- Continuation of the Velocity Frequent Flyer program
- Retention of aircraft and equipment
- As high as \$447m to \$572m cash contribution for unsecured creditors (subject to structure)
- Minimal conditions and regulatory approvals required
- Provision of interim funding and acceptance of economic risk

The Chairperson noted that the Bain transaction would allow a sale as a going concern and provide minimal disruption to operations as opposed to a completion under an ASA.

CREDITORS TRUST

The Chairperson provided a brief description and overview of a creditors' trust and what the creditors' trust set to achieve. The Chairperson noted that under a DOCA creditors' rights were regulated by both the terms of the DOCA and the provisions of the *Corporations Act (2001)* (the **Act**), which dealt with such matters as the right of creditors to appeal against a rejection of a proof of debt.

Further, the Chairperson noted the rights of creditors would transform into the rights of a beneficiary under the terms of the trust instrument with any additional rights under state trustee legislation such as the *Trustee Act 1925 (NSW)* (rather than the Act).

The Chairperson detailed the Creditors' trust under the Bain proposal, noting the creation of a single Creditors' trust to deal with the combined creditor claims of each company in Voluntary Administration. The Chairperson noted the Bain DOCA structure would release all debts and claims against the Companies, except for the excluded claims, details of which were included in the Bain DOCA proposal and were placed on the Administrators' website. The Chairperson noted in return for the releases, creditors would receive an entitlement to receive a dividend from the relevant pool of the Creditors' trust. The single Creditors' trust would comprise of three (3) pools of funds.

The Chairperson proceeded to detail the pools that made up the Creditors' trust and the eligibility of same.

The Chairperson noted that the Administrators considered the Bain DOCA structure with a single Creditors' trust to be in the best interests of all creditors as the structure was an integral part of the proposal that provided the highest return to creditors as a whole and noted that no creditor would be unfairly prejudiced by the arrangements contemplated in the Creditors' trust. The Chairperson noted the Creditors' trust would allow for a more efficient, less costly and quicker turnaround for a distribution to creditors.

ASA

The Chairperson noted, should the Bain DOCA proposal not be approved by creditors, the sale of the business would be completed by way of an ASA, noting the Administrators would adjourn the meeting in these circumstances.

The Chairperson noted that completion of the ASA was dependent upon the transfer of the key assets of the business as well as the transfer of novation of key agreements into a new corporate structure, including property, supplier, financing and service partnerships. The Chairperson noted for this reason the time frame to complete the sale of the business was longer than that of the Bain DOCA under an ASA.

The Chairperson noted Bain would pay a lower amount under an ASA due to the ASA being more time consuming, expensive and difficult to complete. The Chairperson noted although the lower amount to be paid to creditors was still greater than that of a liquidation scenario.

CREDITORS' POSITION

The Chairperson noted the creditor body for the Companies was large and complex with different creditor groups having different rights and priorities under the Act and legal agreements. The Chairperson noted the various creditor groups included employees, bondholders, customers, aircraft financiers and lessors, other financial creditors, trade creditors and landlords.

The Chairperson detailed the estimated number of creditors of the Companies as well as the total number of estimated values of external liabilities as per the Report on Company Activities and Property (**ROCAP**), submitted by the Directors.

The Chairperson noted that the ultimate dividend payable to unsecured creditors would depend on the ultimate quantum of creditor claims which were entitled to participate in a dividend. A formal adjudication process will be undertaken.

ESTIMATED RETURN TO CREDITORS

The Chairperson referred to the sections of the Report which detailed the comparison of returns to creditors under the Bain DOCA proposal, ASA and liquidation.

The Chairperson noted the Administrators had assessed the return to creditors under the Bain DOCA and ASA on both a high and low scenario, whilst the liquidation scenario assessed on predominantly a high scenario as the low scenario saw no return to creditors.

The Chairperson noted creditors would receive a higher return on their outstanding debts in the event of the Bain DOCA proposal being approved by creditors as compared to the ASA or liquidation scenario. The DOCAs would provide an average return to unsecured creditors of between 13% under a high scenario and 9% under a low scenario.

The Chairperson noted the return to employees under both the Bain DOCA proposal and the ASA and the entitlements of continuing employees would be paid in the normal course of trade and those staff who were leaving the Group would be paid their outstanding entitlements in full without having to submit a claim in the DOCA.

The Chairperson detailed the risks to a completion of the sale of business under an ASA due to the complexities of transferring business critical assets such as Air Operator Certificates (**AOC**) and associated critical contracts to a new entity. The Chairperson noted additional benefits of the Bain DOCA proposal being certainty of completion and speed to completion.

The Chairperson detailed the timing of payment of a dividend under both the Bain DOCA proposal and the ASA.

ADMINISTRATORS' OPINION

The Chairperson noted the main purpose of the meeting of creditors, for creditors to decide the future of the Companies.

The Chairperson noted the three (3) options available to creditors being:

- a) The Companies execute a deed of company arrangement; or
- b) The voluntary administrations end; or
- c) The Companies be wound up.

The Chairperson noted, if one (1) of these options was approved, there was no need for resolutions in respect of the other options to be considered.

The Chairperson provided the Administrators opinion, being, that it was in the creditors' interests to approve the DOCAs proposed by Bain. This would result in a significantly greater return to creditors, the continued trading of the Group and the ongoing employment for the majority of employees.

The Chairperson noted the reasons for the Administrators opinions:

- Certainty of continuation of Virgin as Australia's second domestic airline
- Employee entitlements to be covered in full
- Cash contribution to a DOCA / Creditors' trust fund
- Provision of interim funding
- Assumption of liabilities of Administrators
- Assumption of economic risk from 1 July 2020
- Provision of the full value of all travel credits
- Retention of aircraft and equipment
- Minimal conditions and regulatory approvals held
- Continuation of the Velocity Frequent Flyers program

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

The Chairperson noted that before the voting of the resolutions would take place, the Chairperson would first answer questions raised by the Creditors in the registration forms and would then proceed to open the meeting for questions and, pursuant to IPR 75-70(1), any relevant resolutions.

The Chairperson noted the opening of the Q&A function and emphasised the need to enter your name and the creditor to whom was being represented for the purpose of minute taking.

The Chairperson noted that the Administrators had sought to address the majority of the questions in an FAQ which had been placed on the Administrators website.

The Chairperson proceeded to answer the questions received prior to the meeting:

Helena Ryan-Scully of Mechsoft Engineering (QLD) P/L ATF Ryan & Scully Superannuation Fund asked "Given that the November 2019 bond was issued when Virgin already knew they were in a compromised position, great fairness in consideration of refund should be considered as a matter of ethical business behaviour"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

That in the Administrators view the earliest date of insolvency of the Companies was 22 March 2020 but it may have been as early as 18 March 2020. The 1HFY2020 financial statements (dated 25 February 2020) disclosed that the interim financial statements had been prepared on a going concern basis. The Consolidated Group's auditors KPMG did not raise a material uncertainty or make other comment as to going concern. Based on the books and records in their possession and investigations to date, they had not identified evidence that indicated Virgin may have been insolvent at the time of issuing the bond/s or that the HY20 accounts were materially misleading at the time that they issued. They also noted that the Independent Limited Assurance Report that accompanied the prospectus for the bond issues did not raise concern as to the Group's viability.

Grant Fawcett of Grassroots Couriers asked "Why was there such a variation in the amount to be distributed to unsecured creditors? As Bain has stipulated the amount to be distributed under the terms of the DOCAs, surely that amount should be fixed. \$150m was a huge variance, please explain?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

Detailed in Table 32 of the Report, the variance was predominantly caused by any amount that may have become payable by Bain in respect to the Contingent Value Entitlement deed poll, up to a maximum of \$125m.

The Bain DOCA proposal allowed for additional consideration of \$125m in the event the earning of the Companies meets certain hurdles in either or both FY22 and FY23:

- \$62.5m if EBITDAR in FY22 was greater than \$1 billion
- \$62.5m if EBITDAR in FY23 was greater than \$1 billion.

The balance of the difference was due to the complex nature of the ongoing restructuring of the business and the validation of creditor claims, that would influence the quantum of liabilities and return to creditors. The Chairperson referred to section 11.2.6 of the Report.

Meng Hong Lau (private individual) asked "Will Velocity be part of the winding-up process in the event Virgin Group was being wound up? I.e. will the unsecured creditors (bondholder) of Virgin Group"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

As a wholly owned subsidiary of VAH, Velocity Group formed part of the sale of the business to Bain. Furthermore, the net value of the Velocity Group would ultimately be available to the creditors of the Virgin Group in a liquidation scenario.

Luke Chiuchiarelli asked "How was it that the best proposal or at least the options was decided on by the administrators and not the creditors? Listing the company would not only be the better option for stakeholders but for the wider Australian economy."

The Chairperson detailed the following:

Referred to sections 5 & 6 of the Appendix K of the Report which detailed reasons why the Voluntary Administrators did not take Broad Peak & Tor (BP&T) proposal forward including but not limited to:

- The BP&T proposal was highly conditional
- The BP&T proposal did not seem to deliver any certainty or guaranteed return to creditors
- BP&T failed to provide documentary evidence for an interim funding facility of \$125m and additional collateral of \$500m required to underpin any proposal
- The BP&T proposal did not provide any cash for a dividend to be paid to the majority of unsecured creditors.

Yuhong Niu (Investor) asked "Why not convert the debt to equity and allow the market to determine its value?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

This came down to the ability to continue to trade the business without the interim funding. Without the interim funding we would have not been able to continue to trade the business and would have risked the Companies being wound up in liquidation.

John Aitken of Navitaire LLC asked "Assuming that the DOCA was accepted will the Tiger Australia (Tiger) company be "sold" to the Bain Group and our contract managed (confirmed, amended, terminated) by the Administrators management or will Tiger remain with the Administrators to be liquidated?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

Tiger was also transferred to Bain. As disclosed on the ASX on 5 August 2020, under Bain's proposed restructured business operations, Tigerair Australia brand was to be discontinued with AOC and necessary support maintained to provide for the option of ultra-low-cost operations when the market recovers.

Laura Bloxham of VARA asked, "Was VARA secure as an entity of the VA Group with SLAs between departments or was it likely VARA will run as a separate entity within the VA Group and be independent of SLAs with other departments?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

As disclosed on the ASX on 5 August 2020, under Bain's proposed restructured business operations, Virgin Australia was committed to continue its regional operations and charter flying. Relevant negotiations were currently underway with further details to be released in due course.

Allison Somers of VARA asked "Can you confirm there will be a foreseeable market for the domestic airline industry for Virgin Australia. Due to the current situation, has a full proof business structure, policy and marketing strategy been put in place to counteract any line of attack – current/future i.e. pandemics, stock market fluctuations, and global financial crisis?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The transaction was of great significance to Bain who had invested a lot of money into Virgin, which was not entered into lightly. Bain would restructure the airline to ensure it would remain highly competitive and had the ability to weather future storms. The Administrators believed Bain as new owners would be able to see the business through and were well placed to manage both current and future crisis, should they unfold.

John Attard of Virgin Australia asked, "How many aircraft will be left after administration?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

Discussions with aircraft lessors were ongoing, with the current estimate of continuing aircraft falling between fifty-five (55) and sixty (60), with an intention to secure additional aircrafts when the market recovers. The Chairperson noted the intent to increase the number on market recovery.

Paul Considine of Virgin Australia international Airlines asked, "Was there sufficient cash available to cover the maintenance liabilities on the aircraft I.e. maintenance reserves?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

Under the binding sale transaction to Bain, Bain had agreed to provide interim funding of \$125m to enable the business to continue to trade until completion of the transaction and had assumed economic risk for trading liabilities from 1 July 2020. Detailed modelling of fleet configuration and ongoing cash requirements had been undertaken and continued to be adjusted.

The Chairperson noted a number of questions from employees as follows:

Nicholas Elstoft of Virgin Australia asked, "Are you intending on trying to cut pilot and cabin crew EBA wages?"

Stuart Taylor of Virgin Australia asked "Where was the cut-off for pilots considered amongst the small surplus on the 737s? For those that remain, when will we return to a salary and at what rate will we be paid?"

Aaron Moore of Virgin Australia asked "Given there are a small surplus of pilots on the 737, do you plan to protect our entitlements and pay these in full at the current EA rates/conditions until job keeper ends, or pay these out at a reduced rate according to the rate of the EBA at the time?"

Shane Neil of Virgin Tech asked, "Will future VR/CR entitlements be based upon existing conditions, not a new lowered EBA rate for VT Engineers?"

Jeffrey Marshall of Virgin Australia "Have we taken the opportunity to remove the company from EBA commitments that drive millions of dollars of system"

Gordon Mills of Virgin Australia asked "What was the Pay in Lieu of notice entitlement if given a redundancy notice and then stood down without pay within a shorter period than the redundancy notice entitlement period? e.g. entitled to 5 weeks' notice, given more than 5 weeks' notice, stood down without pay 4 weeks after the notice date."

Brittany Cockcroft of VAA asked "If we get stood back up, will we be stood up on full pay? If not full pay, will we be paid more than the Job Keeper payment?"

Yiwei Li of Virgin Australia asked "What will cabin crew EBA look like after the Administration? Would our pairing pattern going to be changed?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The Administrators would speak to Paul Scurrah and the working group to answer the questions by either a forum or another option. There was a full consultation process currently being undertaken with staff groups involving all groups of staff and the relevant unions.

The enterprise agreement was continuing which included the voluntary redundancy consultation period. The key intent of the agreement with Bain was that employee entitlements were preserved, whilst making mention that employees would be paid what they were entitled to, with no intention to limit that to what employees currently receive on Jobkeeper.

The Chairperson noted in the event employees asked to be stood back up, employees would be stood up on appropriate wage rates under their EA's. The Chairperson in response to an additional question surrounding if employees would receive payment for the hours they work, the Chairperson advised that employees would be paid for the work they conduct as it was the employee's rights to receive such payment.

The Chairperson further emphasised the Administrators had sought to preserve all employee entitlements and the importance of same.

Jonathan Coulton of Virgin Australia asked "What guarantee of growth and survival does the Virgin Australia Group have in regards to the history of Bain Capital with the way they purchase financially struggling businesses, adding huge amounts of debt to the already struggling business, keep the current management team that drove the business into previous debts, pay and not disclose large monetary payments to CEO's that are given to ensure they are onboard and drive Bain's ultimate plan with 'investing' into technology (Bain's already owns technology companies so that would be free) and the ultimate destruction of company culture by way of massive job cuts as well as bad working conditions and pay, just so Bain can ensure a good return investment for themselves before breaking up assets and selling off the business in a few short years?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

Bain was successful in investing in a number of companies on a global scale and noted Bain were not in the business to break up and bust up companies. The Chairperson noted Bain were investing a lot of money into the airline and were highly motivated to ensure same was a success.

The Chairperson noted from the sale process and discussions that a substantial factor of what attracted Bain to the sale was the culture of the Virgin team, noting Bain had seen the extraordinary culture and the competitive advantage of same. Bain was motivated to ensure the future success of the business was achieved and realised for the benefit of everyone.

Peter Donahoo of 'FC Donahoo & PA Donahoo T/A Peter Donahoo asked, "Will Paul Scurrah and the current management team of Virgin Australia be kept on?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

Bain had confirmed they were wanting to continue the current CEO and management team of the Companies and noted the instrumental role the management team had played in getting the airline where it was at current. The Chairperson noted they were a highly capable, highly motivated and functional team.

Elizabeth Jacques of Taisei Kanko Australia Pty Limited asked "Was it fair that the Virgin Group rises from the emaciated remains of unpaid unsecured creditors that have contributed to its business to date?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The voluntary administration process which aimed, where possible, to provide an opportunity to continue that majority of the business, if not all. In the event this was not possible the aim to obtain the best return to creditors, noting this was what the Administrators had tried to achieve.

The Chairperson noted the sale process run by the Administrators was in the interest to all creditors that the business continued and given that, it was completely appropriate to sought the sale of the business as it would ensure creditors receive the best return possible.

The Chairperson noted various questions received in relation to ongoing workers compensation claims. However, due to confidentiality, the Administrators would reach out to those individuals separately.

Paul Lukaszewski from Aberdeen asked "Can the Administrators please provide clear analysis and explanation of the enterprise value of the transaction. Please detail the assets being acquired and their book values or estimated values versus what has been rejected, the amount of debt being assumed, and the amount of consideration being paid by Bain?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

This was still being determined and would not be known until the negotiations were complete not only with the aircraft financiers and lessors but also not until the consultation period with employees was complete as these matters will go to the heart of what liabilities were assumed and with respect to the employees, what monies were paid out in entitlements to those employees that were leaving.

The Chairperson noted there were continuing negotiations in respect to aircraft financiers, which determined the amount of secured debt retained versus where aircrafts would need to be realised and any shortfall covered. The Chairperson noted the estimate amount of the shortfall to secured creditors in the Report was intended to be the shortfall after any of said assets were either retained and their debt assumed by Bain or the assets were sold and the realisations were applied on a reduction of debt, with any residual loss becoming an unsecured claim.

The Chairperson noted the Report did not include enterprise value, rather focused on the return of the various different creditor groups. With reference to the liabilities being assumed by Bain, the Chairperson noted the loan amount owing to Velocity from the Virgin Group, secured financier debt estimate continued, lease liabilities assumed estimate, amount of customer credits being retained after offsetting cash collateral to cover merchant exposures with respect to customer credits and cash contribution by Bain under the DOCA Creditors' trust.

The Chairperson noted Bain would not be inheriting any cash/excluded cash being the cash available to the Administrators as at 30 June 2020, as this would be added to the Creditors' trust.

The Chairperson noted the amount of Administrator liabilities Bain would assume under the sale, resulting in positive excluded cash.

Paul Lukaszewski from Aberdeen asked "Can the Administrators please provide greater details about the amount of deficiency claims allocated to various secured creditors, what quantum of their debt has been rejected and how has their deficiency claim been calculated. Why was the unsecured claim associated with operating lessors equivalent to roughly 60% of their overall claim value, the lessors are secured creditors and rejections of their leases will include the return of assets with economic value. What assumptions and analysis have the Administrators made in arriving at such a substantially less estimate for deficiency of this group?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

For the purpose of the Report, the Administrators had made an estimate based on what aircrafts were believed to not be retained, estimate of the time it would take for possession to be given back to those lessors, the time for the lessors to reposition those assets in the market and what amount the claims might be able to be released for in the market given current market rates.

The Chairperson noted at current it was an estimate and ultimately the amount of said claims would be subject to a formal adjudication process. The Chairperson noted the significance of the adjudication of claims for the dividend process.

The Chairperson noted the adjudication of claims at the meeting, were for the purpose of adjudicating for the meeting alone and was not a formal adjudication for the purpose of a dividend distribution. The Chairperson noted the complexity involved with same.

Paul Lukaszewski from Aberdeen asked "Why does the Administrators report not provide full clarity with respect to were respective creditors claims exist and provide clear statements of financial position for each relevant entity to detail credits are being treated in accordance with their respective contracts. As the report notes some creditors will have agreements with distinct virgin entities and other benefits from various cross guarantees, yet the outcome presented sheds no insight into these nuances and suggests the broad group of creditors are being the same."

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The Administrators set out in the Report the deed of cross guarantee groups and the importance of same as a large portion of the entities within the Group were covered under deed of cross guarantees, where in the event of liquidation any party to the deed of cross guarantee would be entitled to participate or to claim in respect to the other entities in that group.

The Chairperson noted the Report aimed to step out the certain guarantees in respect to the other entities, noting a number of the entities were special purpose vehicle entities in respect to aircraft leases which had guarantees back to the main operating entities.

The Chairperson noted the deed of cross guarantee and the structure of the group simplifies the rights between the entities within the group as detailed in the Report.

The Chairperson noted in the event that the Bain DOCAs were approved, creditors would receive a better outcome regardless of which Companies the debts lay within.

Paul Lukaszewski from Aberdeen asked "Can the Administrators please provide the status of aircraft deposits with Boeing? If the Administrators did not request the return of these deposits from Boeing, can the Administrators please provide an explanation of why not?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The Boeing agreement was a commercially sensitive agreement and there were deposits made in respect to the placement of a large number of orders for new aircraft. The Chairperson noted Boeing's rights in respect to the contract.

The Chairperson noted on the Administrators' appointment, Boeing sought to understand if the contract would be ongoing, would the Administrators fulfil the obligations under it. Hence the request for the return of the deposits was not made, as they were there to protect Bain in the event the contract was terminated or amended. The Chairperson noted the Administrators did not expect anything to be returned in terms of the deposits given the large claim of Boeing around the non-performance of the contract.

Paul Lukaszewski from Aberdeen asked "The Administrators receiving approval from the committee of inspection (COI) in respect to their course of action over the course of the process. Are the Administrators bound to take direction from the COI? Since the COI minutes notes simple majority votes were conducted, do the Administrators believe that the composition of the COI fairly represents all creditors, interest fairly and evenly. Why did labour group constitute roughly one third of the COI as compared to bondholder creditors in which there were six thousand and two billion in claim amount, but represented by just four, barely ten percent.

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The COI was elected by the creditors, with no questions or concerns being raised during the resolution being put to creditors at the first meeting of creditors, noting the transparency in the process. The Chairperson noted, in respect to the apportionment of the COI that although there were only four parties with respect to bondholders on the COI, they represented approximately eighty five percent (85%) of the value of the notes.

The Chairperson noted that the Administrators sought to achieve representation for all creditor groups within the COI when the Administrators received the responses and applications of interest to be a part of same.

The Chairperson noted in respect to staff representation in the COI that there was over nine thousand (9,000) employees, of which were members of different union groups who represent groups and functions within the business. The unions who represented their members and the COI was an appropriate forum to allow the unions to be on the COI in line with the fair work act.

The Chairperson noted that the function of the COI as a consulting body and the benefits of same.

The Chairperson further advised the resolution to enter into a binding sale agreement was put forward to the COI, and that no one in the COI had objected to same.

Paul Lukaszewski from Aberdeen asked "Are the Administrators aware of the errors and challenges being faced by bondholders or to creditors with respect to voting. The intended ballots have not reached many holders in time and the Administrators published report incorrectly identified the three (3) resolutions provided for in the bond holder ballot. The COI minutes note numerous concerns raised about the timetable for voting. Are the Administrators comfortable proceeding with the voting procedures that significantly disadvantage a substantial portion of the virgin creditors"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The Administrators had been made aware that some of the beneficial holders of the bonds had difficulties in relation to voting either directly or through the Administrators Australian lawyers being Clayton Utz or the Administrators lawyers being Akin Gump. The Chairperson noted the Administrators had received a number of queries from bondholders during the administration process of which the Administrators had sought to deal with fairly and in a proactive matter at all times. The Chairperson noted the Administration identified the queries early on and sought to resolve vast majority of same.

The Chairperson referred to the various forms of correspondence that set out the procedures governing the manner, timing and whom may vote in respect of the bonds which were prescribed by the bond instrument and the relevant governing law of those instruments. The Chairperson confirmed neither these processes, nor the bondholder timetable were set by the Administrators.

The Chairperson noted the Administrators were very comfortable with all the steps taken and noted that a significant number of bondholders had successfully voted and no error in the report in regards to the US ballot, as well as noting all bondholders and their relevant trustees and custodians had been made aware of the strict statutory timetable for the second meeting at all times and updated on the extension of the timetable the Administrators obtained.

The Chairperson noted both the COI and the noteholder consultative committee which contained representations of a significant number of value of bondholders had been kept up to date throughout the Administration. The Chairperson noted the most recent extension of the convening period was expressly sought to give creditors, such as the noteholders and bondholders more time to consider the Report and get their affairs in order before the voting deadline. The Chairperson noted the Report was loaded on the Administrators website well in advance to the time period of which the Administrators were required to provide same.

The Chairperson noted the challenges that had been reported to the Administrators seemed to relate to the frustrations by bondholders arising from the structure of their own documents, whilst reiterating the significant number of bondholders in number and value who had voted or had received proxies in respect towards the second meeting of creditors.

Didier Berger of Natixis asked, "Was there still a chance for unsecured to be better treated than in the Bain's proposal / a chance for an alternative proposal to be admitted by the administrator?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The question had been covered in both the current meeting and in the Report in respect to the binding nature of the transaction which the Administrators entered into with Bain whilst noting this was done at a time taking into consideration all the facts and circumstances prevalent.

Gary Maguire asked "Why wasn't there an option for the administration to continue either with or without Deloitte as administrator?"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

A key part is being able to continue trading was the interim funding. Without same it would have been unlikely the Companies would be trading. The Chairperson noted the critical nature of same as part of the transaction and noted the Administrators had not been successful in obtaining the funding in the open market.

Tim Hosking (Noteholder) asked "As the Noteholders money was used to purchase the Velocity program, which was profitable, why can't the Noteholders own Virgins part of this company? Seems fair to me."

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The Companies owned and operated the Velocity Frequent Flyers program (VFF) was not subject to the Voluntary Administration but VFF was an asset of the Group. Given a large number of creditors of the Group, all creditors' rights are required to be taken into consideration in respect to the return to creditors. The Chairperson noted it was not appropriate to isolate certain assets for certain creditors to the detriment of others.

Q&A – RECEIVED DURING THE MEETING

The Chairperson noted around forty (40) questions had been received during the course of the meeting and would look to address as many as realistically, quickly and briefly as possible so the meeting was progressed.

What was the legal or logical reason that the Critical Suppliers cannot be disclosed until after vote?

The Chairperson detailed the following:

Critical suppliers were included in the Bain DOCA proposal which is accessible on the Virgin Administration website with details of the critical suppliers and the proposed amounts to be paid to same respectively, being 14.2% average return.

What was the expected timing of payments to employees?

The Chairperson detailed the following:

In the event that Bain's payments were made after the establishment of the Creditors' trust, the distributions would be made to employees as soon as possible. The Chairperson noted the Administrators had been working with Bain in respect to a mechanism to receive funding in advance to be able to ensure that those employees did receive the money quickly at the time their employment ceases with the Group.

Amelia Baker-Roberts asked "am I able to get a refund for my tiger airway flights as we are not in a position to use the credits"

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The Chairperson noted a number of questions from customers around the entitlement to flights. The Chairperson noted the Administrators had spent a significant amount of time in finalising FAQs addressing question/s asked and noted the FAQs answer majority of the questions in respect to customer queries.

The Chairperson noted the key area the Administrators tried to achieve around the travel credits were for customers to receive value for the credits rather than to be relegated to a claim in the Creditors' trust which would take a significant amount of time for a return to be finalised. The Chairperson briefly detailed the design of the travel credits and the value associated with same.

Yoyo Lau asked “when will the creditors (unsecured) know the return percentage, dollar amount and payment date once the sale was complete?”

The Chairperson detailed the following:

There were a number of questions of similar nature that had been asked during the meeting.

The Chairperson referred to Question 39 of the most recent FAQs posted on the Administrators website which detailed a response.

The Chairperson noted that this would be based on when the Administrators complete the adjudication process, with the estimate in the Report falling between six (6) and nine (9) months whilst noting it would likely to be an interim distribution given a further upside that maybe payable under the Bain DOCA proposal.

Marcus Rose asked, “Was the Bain offer the highest price offer that was received and if not how much greater was the alternate offer that was not accepted?”

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The Chairperson noted the sale process and the various stages of same that were completed. The Administrators not only looked at the highest price but also the conditionality and the ability to complete the transaction while noting certainty on completion of the transaction was incredibly important to the Administrators. The Chairperson noted that these factors alongside a number of other factors were taken into consideration when determining which proposal to take forward. The Chairperson noted the underlying elements around the proposals and what made up the bids remained confidential and the Administrators had obligations to all the interested parties regarding same.

The Chairperson noted the Bain transaction created the most amount of certainty and provided for the best return to all creditors.

Why did the Administrators not get a market valuation?

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The sale process that was completed was the Administrators’ way of establishing the market value and was based on a robust process to seek offers which was the appropriate way of determining market value considering the competitive nature of the sale process.

If the DOCA was not approved, will the Company operations cease immediately?

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The Chairperson noted this was not the case and in the event the Bain DOCAs were not approved at the meeting, the intention would be to adjourn the meeting and during that period the Administrators would seek to complete the sale to Bain under the ASA.

Kristen Tomassi (Unsecured Creditor) asked “If the DOCA was accepted today, when will Bain Capital officially become the new owners of Virgin Australia?”

The Chairperson detailed the following:

In the event the DOCAs were approved the DOCA agreement needs to be signed within fifteen (15) business days of the closure of the meeting. Thereafter, an application to the Court must be filed that can take three (3) to four (4) weeks to for the transfer of the shares in VAH to an entity nominated by Bain. On successful application to Court, the DOCAs would then complete. As a result, Bain would become the official owners. The Chairperson refer to the Report which detailed the transfer of ownership would occur no later than 31 October.

Yaron Segal asked “why will the critical suppliers receive an additional return as compared to the other trade creditors, what were the requirements to be considered a critical supplier?”

The Chairperson detailed the following:

The original DOCAs proposal received by the Administrators contained different rates or returns to different class of creditors.

The Chairperson noted the critical suppliers were suppliers that would deem to be critical for the continued operations of the airline, which was part of the proposal by Bain, noting it wasn’t the Administrators election of who was included in the critical suppliers.

The Chairperson noted the return the critical suppliers would receive on average was 14.4%. Comparing to the scenario where all creditors were treated equally, a higher return to critical supplier effectively resulted in a reduced return to the other unsecured creditors of 0.2%.

What will happen if the Companies were returned to the Directors instead of selling the Companies to Bain?

The Chairperson detailed the following:

This was an option for the Administration to end, under which the Companies would be handed back to the Directors together with all the liabilities associated. This would likely result in the Directors resolving that the Companies were insolvent and placing the Companies back into Administrations.

The Chairperson stated this option would not be appropriate given the current status of the Companies.

The Chairperson noted in the interest of time, he would proceed to the next part of the meeting. For other unanswered questions at the meeting, they would be answered via an updated FAQs which will be uploaded to the Administration website.

PROXIES HELD BY THE CHAIRPERSON

The Chairperson noted that creditors should be aware that whilst they were completing their votes on the resolutions, the chairperson would not be formally putting or moving the resolutions for the purpose of the votes on the resolutions until they were counted and until they were read aloud in the meeting.

The Chairperson noted the large amount of proxies being held, amounting to around 6,500 that had been submitted, and that the result of the meeting would only be known once the voting event was closed and the results were read.

The Chairperson noted the amount of proxies held by the Chairperson as of the morning of the meeting were as follows:

- 288 general proxies in the admitted amount of \$60,112,754
- 158 special proxies in the admitted amount of \$183,267,243

The Chairperson noted the intention was to utilise the general proxies held by the Chairperson in favour of the resolution for the DOCAs and the appointment of the COI, in line with the Administrators' recommendation.

The Chairperson referred to the guide for voting enclosed in the Report to Creditors for assistance in voting via the Halo platform.

The Chairperson noted the Primary DOCA was not contingent on approval of the International DOCA or any of the Subsidiary DOCAs being approved. If the Primary DOCA was approved but the International DOCA or Subsidiary DOCAs were not approved, completion of the sale to Bain of the assets of the relevant companies subject to the International subsidiary DOCA would be effected under the ASA. In the event the Primary DOCA was not approved or its conditions not satisfied, no distributions would be made under the Subsidiary DOCAs but the release of claims under the Subsidiary DOCA would not limit creditors rights in respect to any claim in the liquidation of another DOCA company. The International DOCA and Subsidiary DOCAs were conditional on approval of the Primary DOCA however, in the scenario where the Primary DOCA was not approved Bain would have the option of waiving that condition and proceeding with the acquisition of the shares in the relevant international subsidiary companies under the ASA.

The Chairperson noted in respect to the proposed resolution on the COI, all current COI members had consented to be on the COI established in the DOCA, Creditors' trust or in the event of a liquidation.

The Chairperson took the opportunity to specify and thank all of the COI members for their considerable time spent attending the COI meetings, whilst noting the COI meetings had been invaluable as a sounding board for the Administrators throughout the process.

The Chairperson noted in line with the Act, in the event a deed of company arrangement was passed it would be binding on all unsecured creditors, irrespective of whether they voted in favour of the DOCAs or not and binding on secured creditors who had voted in favour of the DOCAs but without compromising their security.

RESOLUTIONS

The Chairperson put forward the following resolutions with respect to the Deed of Company Arrangements (**DOCA**) and the formation of the Committee of Inspection (**COI**). The Chairperson noted, the meeting would be "paused" for 30 minutes to allow those creditors who had not voted to lodge their vote via the Halo platform.

The Chairperson advised that since the resolutions of the DOCAs had passed, the other resolutions in consideration of liquidation or returning the Companies back to the directors did not need to be put to the meeting as a result.

NEXT STEPS


The Chairperson noted the next steps following the meeting being:

- Sign the DOCAs within fifteen (15) business days of the meeting.
- Once the DOCAs were signed, immediately proceed with an application to court for orders under section 444GA of the Act to transfer the shares in Virgin Australia Holdings to Bain. This process was expected to be completed by 31 October 2020.
- Thereafter, the DOCAs would be completed or effectuated, and the Creditors' Trust would be established. Distributions to creditors as stated in the Voluntary Administrators report were expected to be paid within six (6) to nine (9) months after the Creditors' trust being established.

MEETING CLOSURE

The Chairperson opened the meeting for further questions. There were no further questions from creditors.

The Chairperson thanked everyone for their attendance and patience and then declared the meeting closed at 13:05PM (AEST).
