International Convention of the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System - amendments to the Nomenclature effective as of January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022

The Harmonized System (HS), a mechanism used to standardize the basis for Customs tariffs and uniform classification of goods traded internationally, is an instrument developed by the World Customs Organization that is the universal basis for determining customs tariffs and for gathering statistical information on international trade.

The HS is subject to revision every 5 years. The new edition of HS (HS2022), which shall enter into force on January 1, 2022, introduces significant modifications to the current codification, foreseeing more than 300 changes to a wide range of goods moving across borders.

Some of these changes include recognizing new products on the market, reconfiguring some tariff codes, and clarifying legal texts, among other new commodity-specific provisions.

These changes will require the national Customs Authorities to ensure a timely implementation of the HS2022.

At the same time, economic operators must review the classification of their products and implement the necessary product changes/reclassifications, in order to conform to the new edition of HS2022.

Amendments to the HS that are not properly taken into account by those involved in international transactions may have implications for import/export operations, since an inaccurate tariff classification of goods may lead to overpayment/underpayment of customs duties and Value Added Tax (VAT), but also to the incorrect payment of Excise Duties, in addition to possible impacts at the level of complementary information on the conditions for customs clearance of goods.
