Flemish Government Decree of March 8, 2024

Highly skilled workers

Comparative overview

Combined work and residence permit that offers an **exemption** from labour market test, under certain conditions, with the key requirements below:

Education requirement	Minimum bachelor level diploma, waived if: relevant experience; or work in the ICT sector	Minimum bachelor level diploma	Minimum bachelor level diploma
Salary threshold for 2024	<30 years: EUR 40.248 [1] >30 years: EUR 50.310	EUR 50.310	<30 years: EUR 37.305,60 (only for local contracts) >30 years: EUR 46.632 Specific categories: EUR 37.305,60

Special category of the combined work and residence permit, based on an **EU directive** implemented by several Member States within the EU.

Shortage occupations lists

Walloon, Brussels and Flemish Regions


Each region establishes shortage occupations lists which identify occupations with a deficit of qualified workers. These lists form another category of the single permit.

Salary threshold is not applicable, instead subject to:

- Average guaranteed monthly minimum income; or
- Collective Labour Agreement of the sector.

Validity: 12 months - Renewable

The three regions have their own shortage occupations lists. Eligibility to apply for a shortage occupation single permit should be reviewed by the Deloitte immigration team.



Work Authorization- Exemptions


