



78% say **executive support is a barrier** in enabling their organisation from driving deeper cloud adoption across the company



60% are using **cloud technology for smarter energy use** to operate more sustainably




78% say cloud **met expectations regarding enhanced security**, with **46%** saying it **exceeded expectations**



74% of survey respondents cited AI and Cybersecurity as a **critical and strategic technological priority for their cloud transformation strategy,** followed by Data Analytics (72%) and Internet of Things (IOT) (69%)
