Report on subsidiaries contribution to the overall performance of the company during the period under report:

The subsidiaries of the Company have contributed Rs.2,578 Lakhs (0.34%) towards to the consolidated income of Rs.769,437 Lakhs.

### 2. Summary of operations

- During the year, the net revenue from operations of the Company increased by 11 %, from ₹ 691,779 Lakhs to ₹ 771,025 Lakhs.
- The Company's profit after tax stood at ₹ 60,391 Lakhs vis-à-vis ₹ 86,864 Lakhs in the previous year, registering a de growth of 30 %.

#### 3. Transfer to Reserves

The Board of Directors of your company has decided not to transfer any amount to the Reserves for the year under review.

### 4. Material changes and commitments affecting the Financial position of the Company

During the financial year:

 The Company purchased 861,999 equity shares of HashedIn Technologies Private Limited from its shareholders for an aggregate purchase consideration consisting of gross purchase consideration of INR 3,809,754,308.33, equal to USD 51,611,987.11 (converted to INR at exchange rate 73.8153), subsequent to which HashedIn Technologies Private Limited became a subsidiary of the Company.

After end of financial year till date of this report :

 The Company entered into a Share Purchase Agreement with Ad2Pro and certain shareholders of Ad2Pro (the "Purchase Agreement"), and certain additional documents in connection with the Purchase Agreement, pursuant to which, among other things, the Company proposes to acquire 100% of the shares of Ad2Pro for an aggregate purchase price of approximately \$ 50 M and other costs.

### 5. Brief description of the state of the Company's affairs during the year

There has been a sustained growth in the business of the Company. Details of the financial performance of the Company are given above.

### 6. Nature of business

The Company provides consultancy and related support services including technology support, technical, professional and business consultancy to Deloitte Consulting India Projects LP in terms of its Master Services Agreement ("MSA") dated May 31, 2015, and any amendments thereof.

There has been no change in the objects of the Company. Business is being conducted as per the objectives described in the Memorandum of Association of the Company. There has been no material change in the line or nature of business that the Company is operating in.

### 7. Dividend

The Board of Directors of the Company does not recommend payment of dividend for the year ended 31st March 2021.
